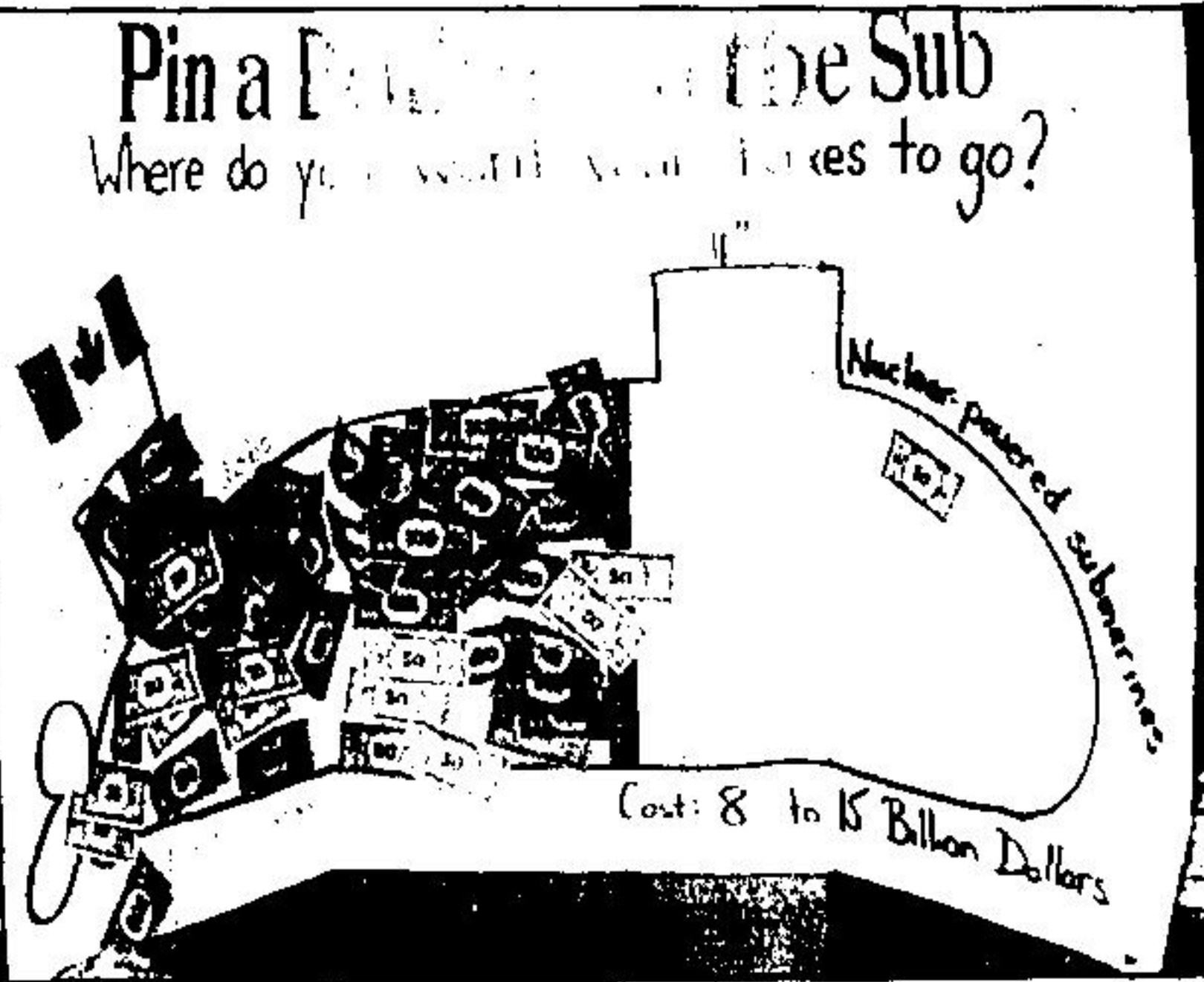


Outlook on Halton Hills

98% don't want submarines

It seems 98 per cent of Halton Hills residents don't think Canada needs nuclear-powered submarines, if a recent poll is any indicator.

Passersby at the Community Open House in Acton last weekend were offered free "tax dollars" (monopoly money) and asked to pin them on a giant cardboard submarine, according to where they would like their money spent. Of 57 people who participated, only one registered a vote for the submarines and 56 people indicated their tax dollars would be better spent on health care, the environment, education, jobs, housing, pensions, parks, or child care.

The "pin-the-money-on-the-sub" action was sponsored by the local group HAND (Halton Hills Action for Nuclear Disarmament). Similar polls were conducted across Canada this month by other peace groups, with similar results. Apparently few people think the federal government should be spending upwards of \$8 billion on the submarines, which Defence Minister Perrin Beatty

feels will offer us more security.

HAND member Peggy Bowhay says, "Security against what? If it comes to nuclear war there is no defence." NATO isn't insisting that we have these subs, say other HAND members. In fact, the two major powers have begun to dismantle some of their nuclear war fighting weapons, so why is Canada wanting to build them?

Results of the unofficial poll will be sent to Perrin Beatty. HAND encourages voters to ask election candidates

what role Canada should be playing to reduce global hostilities and prevent war.

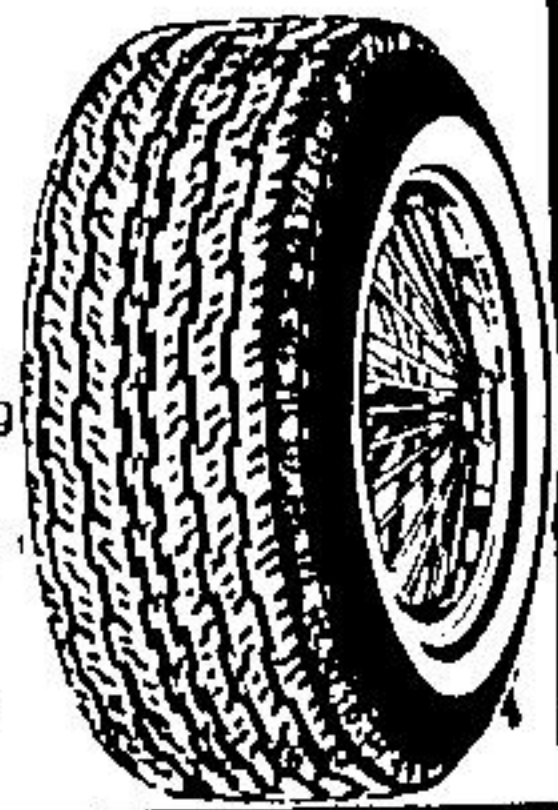
