Precision skating is one of the fastest growing sports in Canada.

It is a team sport involving 12 or more skaters performing various group formations and maneuvers to music. The objective is to have skaters moving in unison. The main emphasis, however, is on participation and enjoyment. Most people are familiar with the chorus line of the professional ice shows.

Teams are made up according to the skater's age of ability. The teams are registered with the Canadian Figure Skating Association. Most new teams choose to compete at the "recreational" level and continue to build and grow, adding new members and increasing the level of difficulty, until they feel ready to enter the "competitive" stream.

At this level the goal is to win a place on the roster for the Canadian Precision Championships, which this year will be held in Edmonton, Alberta, in March.

Precision skating is drawing back to the ice, skaters who had left the sport. It offers the opportunity to continue skating for many years.

Many universities and colleges are now offering the sport. Last year at the Canadian Championships in Toronto, there were Masters Teams competing with skaters admitting to being past the age of retirement.

The Georgetown Figure Skating Club last winter introduced precision skating with two teams: the Ice Dreamers, a pre-novice (12 years and under) and a Junior team (no age limit). Both of these teams achieved success at their first recreational competition in Mount Forest, winning the gold medal and silver medal respectively.

This year we are expecting to add a third team, novice (15 years and under).

### M and M's win three games

## Bantams continue their winning ways

The Georgetown M and M Pro Sports Bantams continue their winning ways with three wins and one loss in their last four games.

In the first of the four game set the locals coked out a win at home against Ching, winning 1-0 in a close contest. The next day the undefeated M and M squad travelled to Orangeville and came away with the victory after soundly thrashing the opposition 9-4.

Georgetown's first loss of the season came when the locals hosted Burlington and dropped a heart-breaker, losing 6-5 after outplaying the visitors by a wide margin.

The M and M's quickly regained their momentum just 24 hours later when they visited Stone Creek and chalked up one more in the win column with a 6-3 victory.

In the Ching match the high scoring hometown squad was frustrated time and time again by hot goaltending but the Adam Hills goal from Elinesky and Lang at 4:28 of the first period was all that was needed for the win. Ching ran into a hot goaltender as well when Peter Downs foiled their big shooters and chalked up the shutout in a fine performance between the pipes for the local M and M's.

Game two of the set in Orangeville was Adam Hagen night when he beat the twine four times to lead the Majors to a 9-5 win.

With the first period going scoreless, Hagen picked up his first marker at the 34 second mark of the second frame when he converted a Guistini pass to set the machine in motion. The M and M's found the mark two more times in the second on goals from Cranford and Elinesky with assists going to Hills, Lee and goaltender Katsilieris. The Orangemen countered with a single goal to close out the frame at 3-1.

The third period saw Georgetown demonstrate their scoring prowess with six more goals to take the win in easy fashion.

Hagen led the drive with three goals while other markers went to Steve Wright with two and Adam Hills with one. Assists went to Amato with two and singles to Wright, Elinesky and Curry.

The M and M Bantams experienced their first loss of the season on Saturday night when Burlington came to town and carted off a 6-5 victory. The loss was a bitter one for the Majors, not because it was their first loss but because they badly outplayed the opposition and could not register the win.

The game however did have a bright spot with Trevor Elinesky picking up his second hatrick of the early season with an assist to boot.

Georgetown got on the score board first with Elinesky's first marker from Cranford at 3:19 of the first period. The M and M squad jumped into a two-goal lead at the 58 second mark of the second period with a goal by Hagen from Elinesky and Hills.

Burlington, however, bounced back with three unanswered goals in the same frame to carry a 3-2 lead into the third period.

Elinesky tied the score at three apiece when he converted a Hills pass at the 15-second mark of the final frame but the visitors rallied for two goals in just one minute to regain the lead.

Georgetown fought back with a goal by Hills from McIntyre and Lee but Burlington quickly nullified the Hills marker when they scored just 15 seconds later.

The M and M's made it close with

Elinesky's third goal from Hagen at 9:08 but despite a valiant effort they could not pull off the win. Final score: Burlington 6, Georgetown 5.

The local Majors quickly put the Burlington loss behind them when 24 hours later they travelled to Stone Creek and once more regained their winning form with a 6-3 victory.

Sean Guistini got the local lads rolling with a goal at the 43-second mark of the first period from Mark McIntyre.

Georgetown found the mark twice more in the first with goals from Lewis unassisted and Kosziwka from Curry. Stone Creek scored once to run the score to 3-1 in favor of the M and M's after one period.

Georgetown picked up the only marker of the second frame when Mitch Butt scored on a nifty three-way passing play from Guistini and Lewis.

The final period saw both teams scoring a pair of goals to run the final score to 6-3 in favor of the M and M squad.

Georgetown's final two goals went to Shaun Curry from Wright and Guistini and Lewis.
