

Hydro introduces time-of-use rates

Ontario Hydro will introduce industrial time-of-use rates in January, Chairman and President Robert Franklin said recently, in announcing the utility's average 5.3 per cent electricity price increase for 1989.

The 5.3 per cent price increase approved by Ontario Hydro's Board of Directors is slightly lower than the 5.5 per cent the utility proposed to the Minister of Energy in the spring and the 5.8 per cent recommended by the Ontario Energy Board, Rural customers served directly by Ontario Hydro will receive an average price increase of 5.9 per cent.

the lowest, at night and in the sum-"Industrial time-of-use rates are

The wholesale prices charged by Ontario Hydro to the province's more than 300 municipal utilities will increase by about five per cent, adding about \$3 to the average residential bill. Actual municipal rate increases will vary from utility to utility, depending on local costs.

Time-of-use rates will likely not be offered to residential customers until the early 1990s. By that time, those municipal utilities who opt into the program and decide to make time-of-use pricing available to their customers will have new meters and
