Halton's planning and public works committee voted to ban the use of styrofoam cups Oct. 25.

The idea is to promote its own expanded recycling program and styrofoam cups are not recyclable.

Halton's Medical Officer of Health Dr. Graham Pollett said fluorocarbons present in styrofoam make them impossible to recycle.


