Discussion on workplace smoking

At the Georgetown Chamber of Commerce November Directors Meeting, Mr. Tom Shepard, Director of Parks and Recreation spoke about the smoking policy drawn up

for town employees and facilities. Of interest to the business community is the proposed bylaw that the Town of Halton Hills facilities enroll in a stop smoking program. and the potential to control smoking in all buildings where the public has

Mr. Shepard offered a background into the smoking policy and the direction the Town of Halton Hills will be taking in the future.

in 1987 the Town was challenged by the Cancer Society to institute a no smoking policy for the town, its employees and buildings. In this malter there are three areas of turisdiction, private business policies, bylaws for public areas in the town and the Ministry of Labour who control smoking in the work place.

The Town surveyed their employees and found that 84 per cent wanted smoking controlled, so a policy to control smoking was drawn up. The policy designates certain areas of buildings where smoking is

permitted. All work stations will be smoke free. A bylaw will also be passed similar to the policy so that the public as well as town employees will not be permitted to smoke in town-owned buildings unless they are in designated smoking areas. The Town will offer to all town will be passed to control smoking in employees \$200 each so they can
