

DEAR POLLY - Must frozen corn on the cob be defrosted before cooking? — AMANDA

DEAR AMANDA - Some authorities recommend thawing home-frozen corn on the cob because they feel if it is cooked frozen, the kernels will overcook while the inside of the cob stays cold. In other words, it's difficult to get the frozen ears to cook evenly. However, I've found that simmering it gently in milk or water to which a little sugar has been added produces good-tasting results with a minimum of effort. Just cook it until It seems tender and to your liking. -POLLY

RECIPE OF THE WEEK: On a cold fall day, nothing beats a bowl of steaming bot soop - and the following recipe for Super Clam Chowder is as simple as opening a few cans.

Combine 1 can cream of celery soup, I can cream of potato soup, 1 can New England clam chowder, 5 ounces of canned whole, small baby clams with their liquid, and I cup half-and-half. Heat, stirring constantly, to just below the boiling point. Serve with oyster crackers on the side.


