Traditionally designed, the two storey house will feature a notched white pine timber frame held together with old-style wooden pegs. Pine clapboard will face the out de of the building.

The walls will be constructed of special stresskin insulation panels which consist of urethane foam insulation bordered by chipboard on

doing." Constructed on a basic old-style saltbox design, Mr. Long and the builders also made provision for ex-
