Students take part in science days

A contingent of students from Georgetown District High School are among approximately 1,200 senior students, along with some of their teachers, from 45 Ontario secondary schools who will participate in the University of .Waterloo's computer science days, Dec. 7-15.

They will learn how computer science is taught at UW and rotate

among several workshops developed in response to changes in computer use, and new technologies. As well, they will try their hand at database management, spreadsheets, com-puter graphics, Hyprcard and numerical computation.

UW's computer science days offers mathematically-inclined high school students, interested in com-

puter science, a chance to experience a university and meet with university students and professors.

The program has been in existence at Waterloo for 20 years. It is offered twice a year with approximately 1,200 student visitors each time. Over the years approximately 50,000 have participated.
