## Peewees frustrated in loss

The Georgetown Major B Peewees visited Milton on Nov. 28 and came away with a frustrating 4-3 loss.

As has been the case all season, the team took more penalties than their opposition (nine vs five for this game). As usual, a number of them were of the foolish variety. The difference is that the team is now playing better. Previously, the penalties would only tack a goal or two on top of an already lop-sided score. Jason Quinn, who fed Deruchie. After beating the defenceman, Deruchie deked the goalie to his knees, and lifted a forehand shot high into the net.

Milton tied the score on a fluke play, without touching the puck. They were on the powerplay. A scramble around the Georgetown net left the goaltender down, and the puck at the top of the crease. One of the Georgetown defencemen tried to pass the puck to the goalie, but it slipped past him, and into the net. The period ended at 1-1.

After Milton took the lead early in the third, Georgetown tied it up. A blocked shot at the locals' blueline went to Deruchie, who out-skated three defencemen, deked the goalie, and put the puck in the net. Three minutes later, Milton went ahead again. But once again, the locals responded, as Quinn pounced on a Deruchie rebound and fired it home.

It was tied at 3-3.

Milton got the winner on a powerplay, with 6:53 to go. Georgetown had just killed a two-man-short situation, and had one man in the penalty box at the time. The locals pulled the goaltender in the final minute of the game, but they could not muster an attack, and the game ended at 4-3.

Defensively, Ken Brown led the team in takeouts, with three. Tim Penny (with two), Andrew Marshall, Charlie Snook and Derek Ruffolo blocked shots. And Seth Homer and Darryl Casselman split the goaltending duties.
