A tough draw proved to be the downfall of the Georgetown Rebels senior boys volleyball team as the Rebs ended their season at the OF-SAA championships in Hamilton

Georgetown, ranked eighth in the triple-A category, met both the number one and number two seeds in the round robin event and finished out of the running with an overall 2-2 final slate.

After handily defeating both Donovan and Loyalist the Rebels dropped matches to number two seed and eventual OFSAA champions Colonel By (Ottawa) and number one seed and Ontario finalists Applewood (Peel). Colonel By went on to upset Applewood in the gold medal final.

Georgetown met Colonel By after recording easy two-game match wins over both Donovan and Loyalist. After dropping the opener to Colonel By, the Rebels put it together in game two and the Ottawa squad was forced to pull out all the stops in a 15-13 clincher.
