Host Oakville on Sunday

Peewee B's find goalposts

The Georgetown Major B Peewees lost two league contests and one exhibition game last week. The locals played Oakville, at Oakville, on Wednesday, and lost a game that they played well enough to win.

The visitors took a 1-0 lead into the second period. The score came on a powerplay. The line of Andrew Marshall, Matt Anderson, and Michael Travers puzzled the Oakville net. The goalie went

down, the puck went behind the net and out the other side, where Marshall was positioned to drive it home. Travers and Anderson got assists.

After a scoreless second period which saw Matt Deruchie hit a goalpost, Deruchie notched a short-handed marker, on a wrist shot from the right faceoff dot. Michael Bahr had caused the Oakville defence to cough up the puck, and he received the assist. However,

Oakville replied with their first tally before the penalty expired. It was 2-1.

A couple of minutes later, at 11:04, Oakville tied the score. Bahr dinged one off the goalpost, on a good scoring chance, and then Oakville scored the go-ahead marker. With about five minutes left in the game, Marshall had a good chance, but his high shot hit the goalpost square on. Three goalposts! Oakville closed out the scoring a minute later, on a soft shot that hit the goaltender's stick, and bounced over his shoulder, into the net.

Defensively, Derek Ruffolo blocked six shots, and Ken Brown and Bahr one each. Darryl Casselman and Seth Homer split the goaltending duties.

On the weekend, Georgetown lost 5-0 to the powerful Burlington squad, and 4-1 to the Chinguacousy GSN Sport Enterprises team. Seven of the nine goals were a direct result of playing the puck, instead of the man, in the locals' zone. Deruchie scored the lone Georgetown goal, pouncing on the GSN goalie's miscue, and sliding the puck into the net.

Georgetown's next game is Sunday, Dec. 11, when they entertain Oakville at Gordon Alcott Arena.

At the midway mark of the opening frame with the home down 1-0, Steven Smith shot the puck into the Orangeville end of the rink. Brad Kouyoumjian beat a defender and fired a quick pass out to Brad Davidson in the slot. Davidson one-timed it and the game was tied. Two minutes later the visitors went ahead again on one of the strangest goals of the season. One of the forwards broke into the clear down the right side and went in all alone on goalie Kevin Humeniski.

Kevin stood his ground and made a great diving stop as the opposing player tried to go around him. Both

players ended up lying on the ice after the play but the Orangeville player somehow managed to sweep the rebound around the post just out of Kevin's reach.

Five minutes into the third period the new line of Sam Butt, Allan Rasmussen, and Ricky Clark was buzzing around the visitors' net when it appeared that the puck would be moved up the ice.

Then Ricky stopped the puck carrier and Allan pounced on the loose puck. He passed up to Sam who brought the Georgetown supporters to their feet with a beautiful shot into the top corner.

Although this is Sam's first year with the team he shows great promise and both of his goals have been the result of good heads up play around the net.

Chiefs get scalped

The Domtar Packaging Minor Peewee "AA" Chiefs displayed some inconsistent play over the last two weeks as they continue their march to first place in Tri-County standings.

In Burlington on Nov. 19, the Domtar Packaging squad bewildered coaches Chris Milne, Dan Curtis and Wally Petrie with an indifferent effort that saw them lose by a score of 4-1. Duane Erler scored the lone goal for the Minor Peewees with an assist to Mark Aldridge.

The Chiefs hosted a strong Orangeville side at Memorial Arena on Tuesday night and eked out a 4-3 victory. 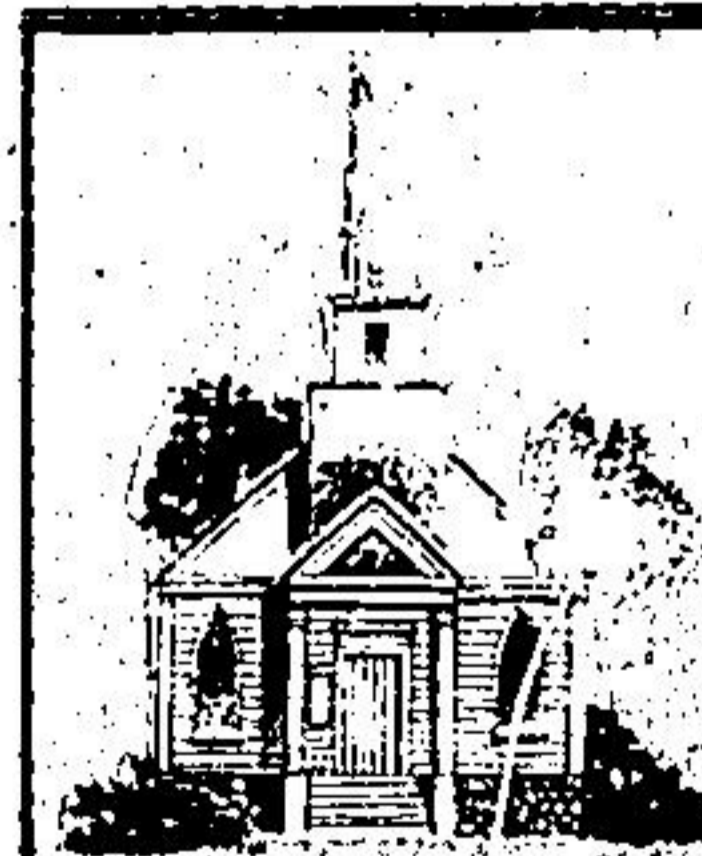
