

# Today's appliances make kitchen cleanup easier

Frequented by family, friends and guests, the kitchen may be the most public room in the home. It's also the room treated with the most loving disrespect. Hence, the war for kitchen tidiness goes on.

Of course, kitchen upkeep never has been easier, thanks in part to today's major appliances, which combine high performance with sleek designs, features and materials that make cleaning a breeze.

Cooking appliances probably endure more messes—and cleaning—than any others. But they also offer some of the best "dirt-defying" features.

The self-cleaning oven is a prime example—extremely high temperatures literally burn soils off oven walls, leaving only a fine ash that's wiped away easily with a sponge or damp cloth.

The self-cleaning oven continues to evolve. For example, self-cleaning built-in ovens from KitchenAid offer a variable time control that lets the cook choose the amount of cleaning time needed. Cleaning can be programmed to stop once soils

have been eliminated, saving energy and energy dollars.

Built-in cooktops are growing in popularity and cleanability. For example, many electric open-coil cooktops offer removable cooking elements and chrome-plated drip pans, and some models even offer a lift-up top with built-in support rod that allows the entire cooktop to be lifted for easy access to spills in the burner box.

Raised edges on most cooktops keep in grills and boil-overs off cabinets and countertops, and models from KitchenAid feature exclusive triple-action concealed hinges along the back edge, enabling the cook to raise the rear of the cooktop and reach spills in the rear of the burner box.

Solid cast-iron cooking elements have become very popular in the U.S. over the past couple of years. The solid surface easily wipes clean, and there are no burner bowls to clean.

Cooktops featuring solid elements in sleek glass surfaces are the ultimate in

easy cleaning: The permanently sealed elements have no drip bowls to remove and clean, and they prevent spills from entering the burner box.

Gas cooking appliances have their own cleanability features to boast about, including cast-iron grates, drip pans and control knobs. All of these components travel easily to the sink for washing and cleaning.

Again, many gas cooktops offer lift-up tops with support rods for holding up the cooktop, and reaching the burner box.

Surfaces aren't the only cleanliness challenge in a kitchen; cooking also can foul the air. Again, new technologies are available to solve the problem.

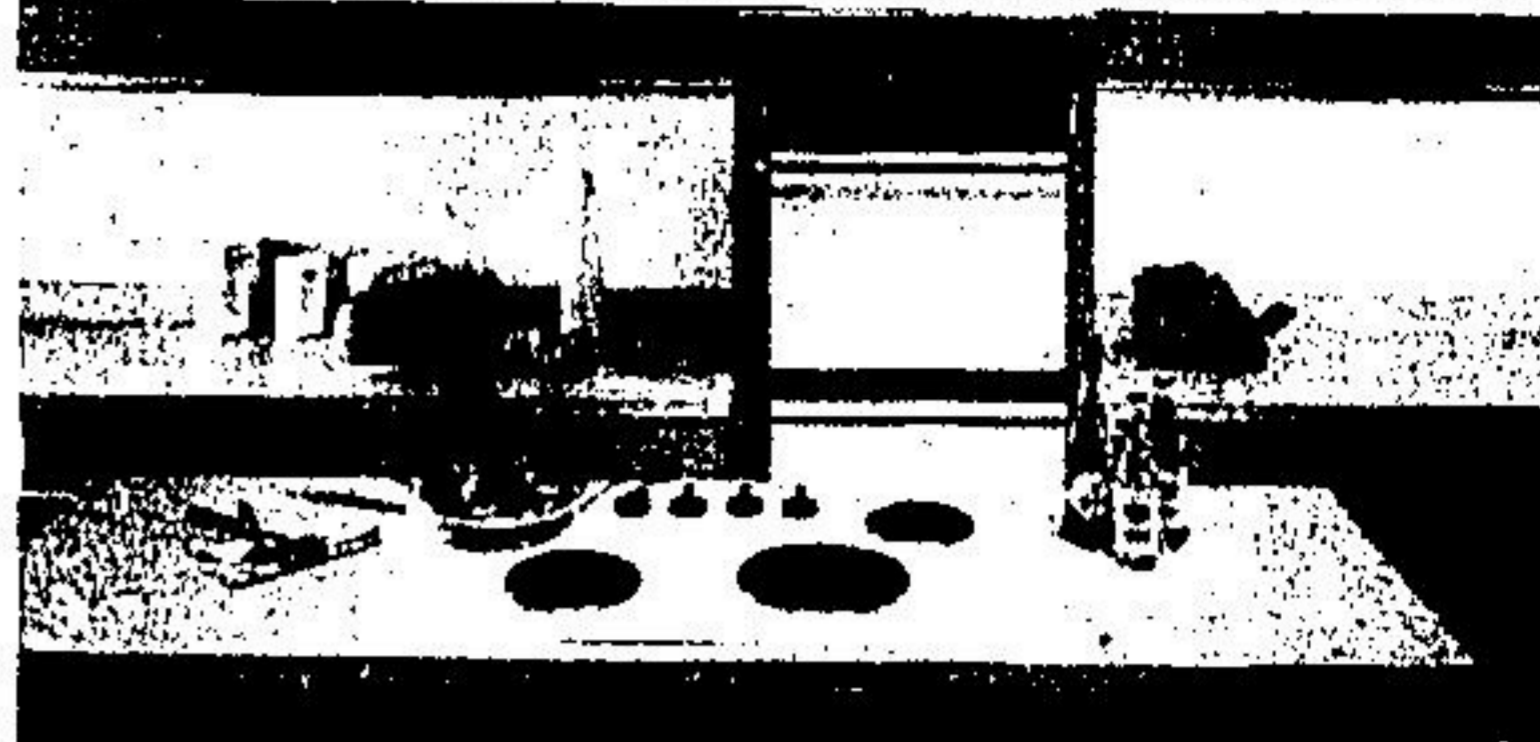
For example, KitchenAid electric built-in ovens offer a Smoke Eliminator, which runs automatically during high temperature baking, broiling or self-cleaning, when smoke is most likely to occur.

The Smoke Eliminator system does away with the need for costly, cumbersome outside venting, and enables homeowners to install a built-in oven on an inside wall.

The kitchen cleanability story goes well beyond cooking products, with virtually every major appliance boasting important easy-clean features. Textured steel refrigerator doors hide fingerprints and wipe clean easily; smooth, flush touch control pads on dishwashers eliminate hard-to-clean buttons and knobs; and don't forget the unsung hero of the

kitchen cleanup saga—the trash compactor, which diminishes the need for unsightly and potentially unsanitary wastebaskets.

Cleanliness in the kitchen still requires some effort but, with a big assist from today's major appliances, homeowners have an easier time winning the battle.
