**Grant approved for house**

A recent announcement by John Sweeney, Minister of Community and Social Services and Chaviva Hosek, Minister of Housing will have a major impact on the work of Halton Women's Place.

A grant of over \$30,000 to hire a housing co-ordinator will allow the shelter for abused women to have a staff member to compile a placement directory, interact with other housing groups and act as an advocate on behalf of abused women and their children when they seek housing.

"I am happy to see that my government has acted on this recommendation by the Halton Access to Permanent Housing Committee," MPP Walt Elliot said. "The tragedy of abused women and their children is terrible enough, without the added problems caused by an inability to find a decent place to live."
