## Elliot heads new committee

A provincial committee, led by Halton North MPP Walt Elliot, hopes to come up with a comprehensive plan by next summer for the waste management crisis now spreading throughout Ontario.

Mr. Elliot, who was recently appointed chairman of the waste management committee of the Liberal caucus, said the solution will be a combination of landfilling, burning and recycling garbage.

The target will likely be, to burn one-third of the waste in energy from waste plants, recycle one-third and landfill the rest, said Mr. Elliot.

Included in that recycling figure is a proposal to increase composting in areas where space allows it, he said.

The increasing controversy surrounding landfilling is grabbing headlines, but the key to the waste management plan is to boost the province's recycling effort, said Mr. Elliot.

Energy from waste will be an important factor in the waste management plan, but the 18-member committee has at least two significant reservations about EFW, said Mr. Elliot. The first is that there is a tendency to lean too much on EFW once a plant is in operation. "In some countries,

counties. Many counties handle their waste disposal differently, he said. In most counties, local municipalities, rather than the county's governing body, is in charge of waste disposal. That leads to a great variety of waste disposal methods, he said.

Many counties don't even have an over all plan for waste management, he said.

they burn a lot of stuff that doesn't need to be burned," said Mr. Elliot.

Secondly, experts "are not exactly sure of the emission levels" from the plants, he said.

The committee will have to study how garbage disposal is handled in Ontario's eight Regions and 26

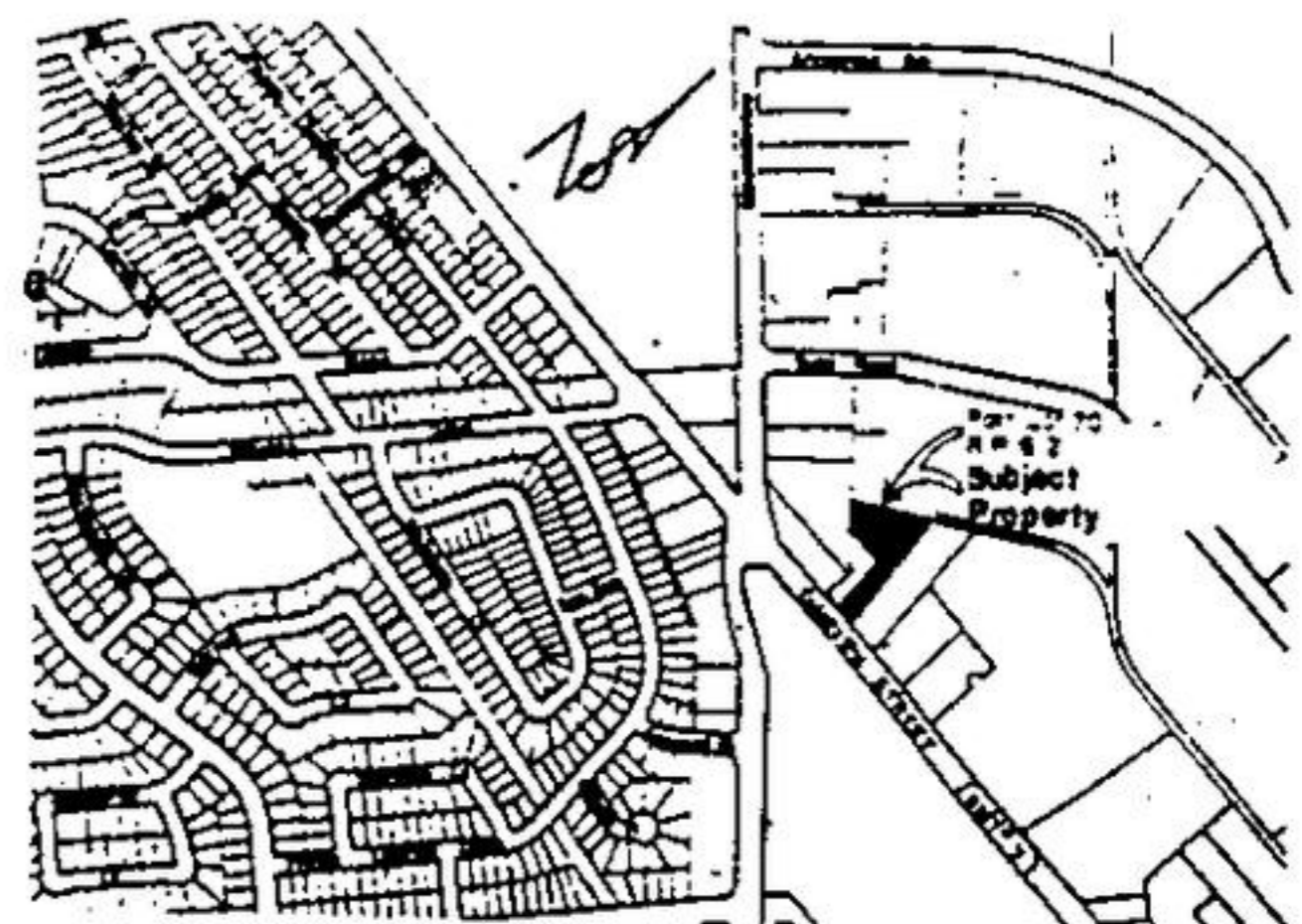

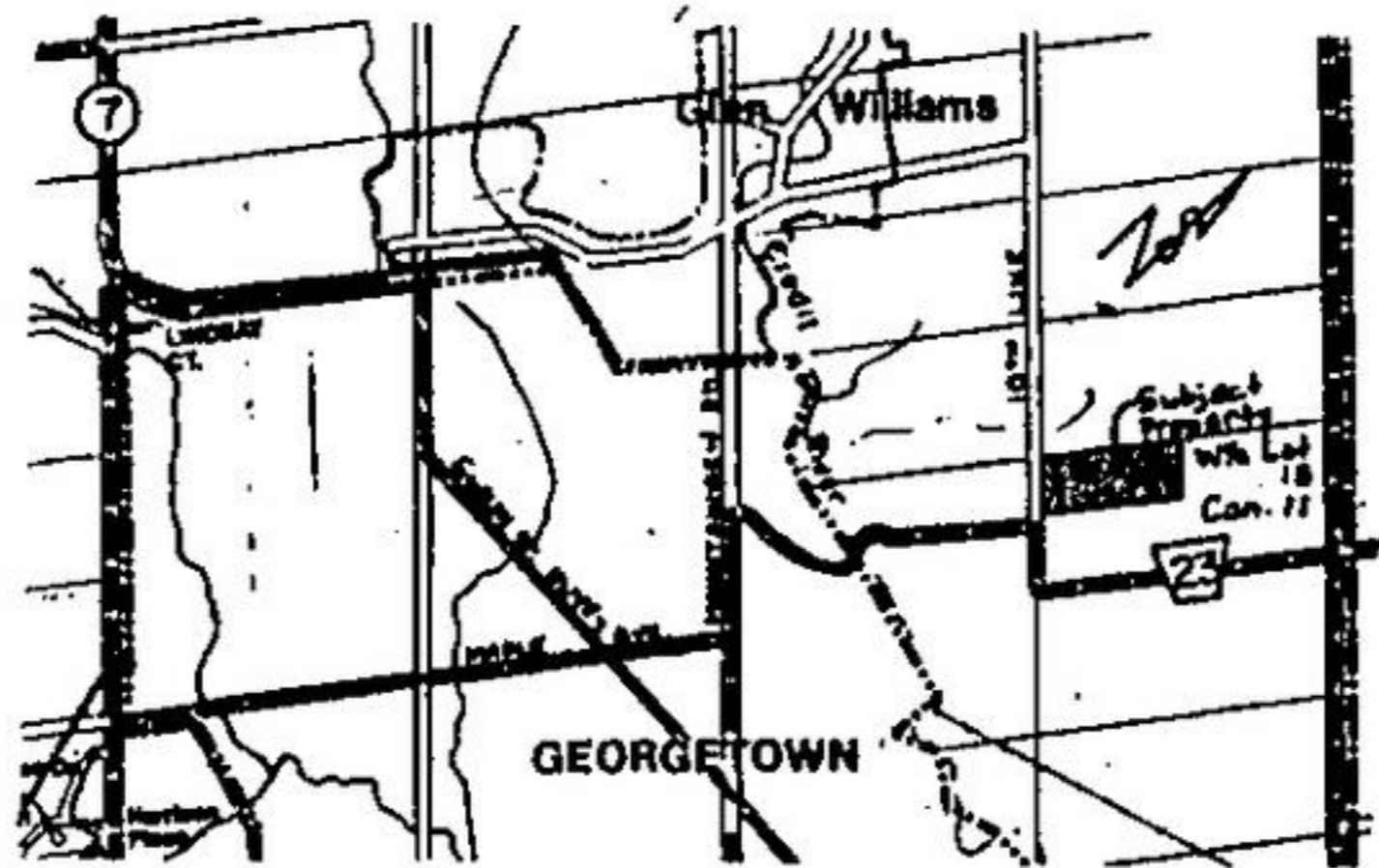

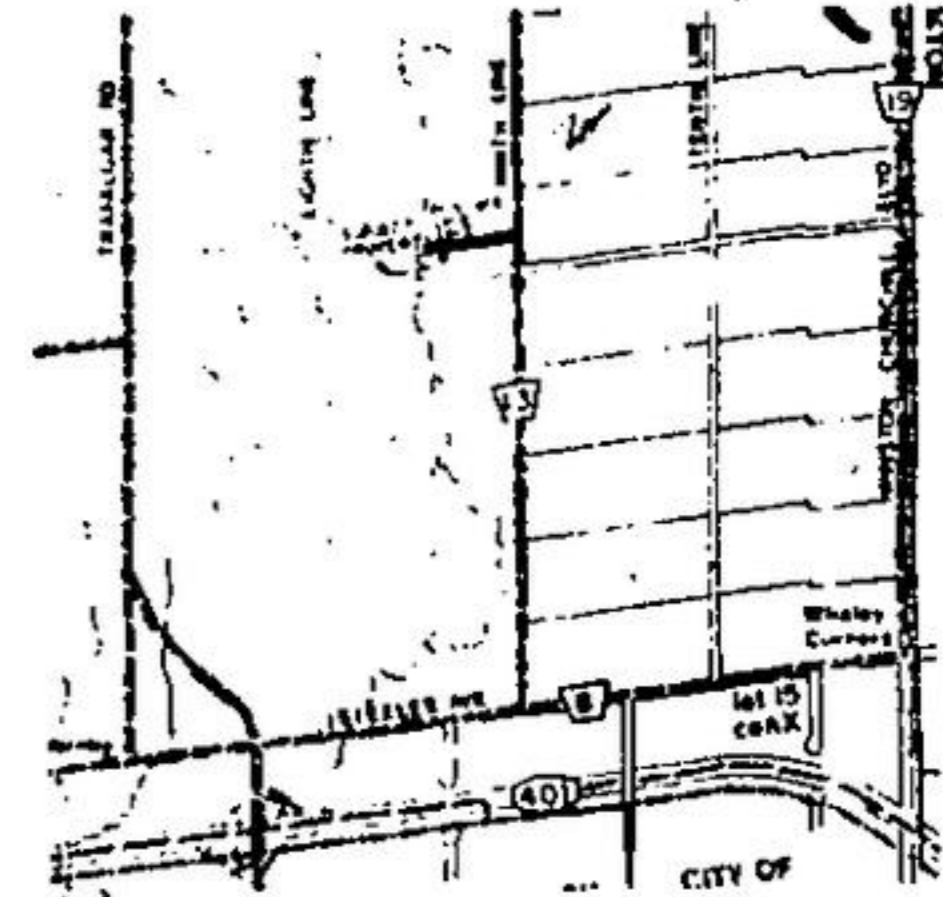
