

Here is a delicious recipe for peanut butter cookies. You will have to know your math to figure it out, though. The amount of each ingredient used is shown in parentheses () and is a math problem. Figure each one out before you get started.

(1 - 1/4 =	) cup unsifted flour
(1/4 + 1/4 =

Stir baking powder and flour together in a bowl.

2. In another bowl, cream butter and peanut butter together. Beat in the following ingredients, one at a time: brown sugar, granulated sugar, egg and vanilla.

3. Add flour mixture and mix well with a spoon.

4. Drop by spoonfuls, about 2 inches apart, onto ungreased cookie sheets. Press down with fork dipped in flour, making crisscross pattern. Reflour fork for each cookie.

5. Bake in preheated 350-degree oven for about 10 minutes. Let cookies stand in pan for 1 minute then remove with spatula.



Peanut by Millicent Selsam. Grs. 2-4. Using close-up photos, the life cycle of the peanut plant is shown in simple but exact terms.


The Peanut Cookbook by Natalie Donna. Grs. 3-5. Recipes using peanuts and peanut butter and featuring whole foods.



#### A PEA or a NUT?


Change pea to nut changing one letter on each step of the word ladder to make a new word each time.
