Making scents Celeb fragrances nose out the rest

It is perhaps not surprising that fragrance manufacturers would begin to market their wares to appeal to a nation that reads 3 million copies of People magazine a week and eats dinner while watching "Lifestyles of the Rich and Famous."

But the sheer number of celebrity fragrances newly on the market or scheduled to appear shortly is staggering — even though they still account for a relatively small percentage of the more than 800 fragrances now available in the United States.

Cher has launched "Uninhibited," a \$175-an-ounce scent by Parfums Stern, which has kicked off with a promotional blitz. Industry experts are comparing it with the \$10 million campaign that helped make "Elizabeth Taylor's Passion" one of the top five fragrances in stores where it's sold.

On Nov. 15, in California, musician Herb Alpert will raise the curtain on "Listen," an \$85-per-half-ounce women's scent.

Next year, ballet superstar Mikhail Baryshnikov will bring a women's scent, called "Misha," to market, even as Latin crooner Julio Iglesias woos us with his own potion. Joan Collins, "Dynasty" actress and former "Scoundrel" spokeswoman, will unveil a perfume in 1989. Priscilla Presley and teen-age tennis ace Gabriela

Sabatini are concocting scents with Colonia Inc., both of which are scheduled to be served up in 1990. Even mega-developer Donald Trump and Olympic Gold Medalist Florence Griffith-Joyner have reportedly been approached about doing fragrances.

These brews will compete for attention on fragrance counter shelves that are already crowded with such earlier smells as "Sophia" (as in Loren); "Deneuve" (as in Catherine); "Dionne" (as in Warwick); "Glorious" and "Vanderbilt" by Gloria Vanderbilt; "Tova" (as in Mrs. Ernest Borgnine); "Paloma Picasso"; "Niki de Saint Phalle" (after a French sculptress by the same name); and "Pavlova" (as in ballerina Anna Pavlova). There's even a Bjorn Borg fragrance.

"Forever Krystle," the scent inspired by the character played by Linda Evans on "Dynasty" and promoted by the blond actress, is still the No. 4 best-selling fragrance in mass market four years after its introduction. "Carrington," a complimentary men's fragrance introduced in 1985 and promoted by "Dynasty" colleague John Forsyth, can also still be found.

Royalty groupies can still buy "Wedding Bouquet," an unofficial tribute to Prince Charles and Princess Diana launched at the time of their marriage, and "Fergie," named after the Duchess of York. Michael Jackson fans, however, are out of

luck: The Gloved One's "Magic Beat" line of scents disappeared quickly after its debut.

Celebrity scents permit consumers to indulge in fantasies that, by buying a pricey elixir bearing the name of someone they admire, they can somehow become like that person. For perfumers, celebrities furnish a ready-made identity package around which they can easily build a fragrance and marketing campaign. And once on the market, celebrity scents have immediate and strong name recognition.

But celebrity scents also have a built-in disadvantage: They come with high expectations that they must live up to.

"Elizabeth Taylor's Passion" is the perfumer's textbook example of a celebrity fragrance done right. The faceted crystal bottle brings to mind the actress's famous jewels. The lavender color of everything from the perfume's bottle to a recently added scented bath powder suggests Taylor's famous violet eyes. The floral Oriental fragrance itself hints of romance — something the oft-married Taylor is associated with on- and off-screen.

Meanwhile, at least one designer scoffs at the celeb-scent trend. "Fragrance belongs in the hands of designers, not celebrities," menswear designer Bijan recently declared. "Do I get up on the stage and try to act or sing?"

Tarragon chicken is a quick wrap

Lean, skinned chicken breasts stay moist and tender when microwaved in parchment or in cooking packets with their seasonings.

Wrapping foods to intensify flavors and retain moisture is not new. Clay,

corn husks, and banana, grape and baobab leaves have been used in cooking for generations in different parts of the world.

Wrap and serve each chicken breast separately. Unwrap carefully when ready to eat.

TARRAGON CHICKEN AND PEARS

- 4 (about 4 ounces each) boneless, skinned chicken breast halves, sliced
- 2 pears, cored and sliced
- 1 small onion, sliced
- 3 tablespoons each: melted butter or margarine and dry white wine
- 1 tablespoon chopped parsley
- 1 teaspoon each: lemon juice and grated lemon peel
- 1/4 teaspoon tarragon, crushed
- Salt and pepper to taste

Microwave method: Place 1 sliced chicken breast half, 1/4 pear and 1/4 onion on each of 4 squares of parchment paper. Combine butter, wine, parsley,

lemon juice, peel and tarragon; pour over each chicken breast. Sprinkle with salt and pepper. Seal packets. Microwave on High for 7 minutes, or until chicken is cooked. This kitchen-tested recipe makes 4 servings.

Conventional method: Substitute aluminum foil for parchment paper. Bake at 375 degrees for 25 to 30 minutes, or until chicken is cooked.

| 6 | slices bacon, chopped | 6 |
| 2 Tbsp | flour | 30 mL |
| 1 1/2 tsp | chicken bouillon mix | 7 mL |
| Pinch | cayenne | Pinch |
| 1/4 cups | undiluted CARNATION 2% Evaporated Milk | 300 mL |
| 1 cup | water | 250 mL |
| 1/2 cup | grated Parmesan cheese | 125 mL |
| 1/2 cup | shredded mozzarella cheese | 125 mL |
| 1/2 cup | seeded diced fresh tomato | 125 mL |
| 2 Tbsp | chopped parsley | 30 mL |

Cook linguine according to package directions. Meanwhile cook bacon in medium saucepan until crisp. Drain, reserving 2 Tbsp (30 mL) drippings. Set bacon aside. Blend flour, bouillon mix and cayenne into bacon drippings. Stir in evaporated milk and water. Cook and stir over medium heat until mixture boils and thickens. Remove from heat. Add Parmesan and mozzarella cheeses. Stir until melted. Pour sauce over linguine; add reserved bacon, tomato and parsley. Toss to coat. Serve immediately. Makes 3 or 4 servings.
