Matthew, 16, sustained serious spinal injuries during a freak swimming accident while his family was vacationing in the Dominican Republic in December.

Matthew is now undergoing treatment at Toronto's Sick Children's Hospital and a local trust fund has been opened for the Grade 11 Acton High School student.

Individuals interested in contributing to Matthew's trust fund can do so at the Halton Credit Union, located at 273 Queen St., Acton.

"Harold Postma (branch manager of the Acton office) was very pleased to set this up," said Matthew's aunt, Renata McPherson, last week. "The high school is also doing some type of fundraising."

Meanwhile, students from the high school sent a giant card to Matthew who was able to sit up and read the card in his hospital bed last week.

Matthew, who has undergone four operations to realign and stabilize his injured spine, is not scheduled for any further surgery, said Mrs. McPherson.
