Disappointing week for Peewees

goalie for the extra attacker, but a long shot found the mark, and the final score stood at 4-2.

Weldwood then met a Belgrave team that was much smaller, man-for-man, than the locals. Unfortunately, Georgetown self-destructed, taking six penalties to the opponents' one, including one that extended into overtime.

The locals jumped into a 2-0 lead. Travers split the defence and potted a wrist shot from the slot for the first goal. Two minutes later, Travers won the faceoff in the Belgrave end. The puck went back to Derek Ruffolo, and his slapper found the mark. Belgrave countered a couple of minutes later, and the teams went into the third with the score at 2-1 for Georgetown.

Bridge winners


Bob Jackson and Harry Arbic were the big winners in individual bridge play at the Georgetown Legion recently.
