

Woman injured

A Milton woman was injured in a single-car collision on Guelph Street early Saturday morning. Halton Regional Police say a westbound 1981 Chevrolet Malibu driven by the 18-year-old woman, rounded a curve near Winston Churchill Boulevard when it went out of control and struck a guard rail. The car was moderately damaged. The woman was taken to Georgetown and District Memorial Hospital where she was treated and released. Police have charged the driver under the Highway Traffic Act.

A Georgetown woman has been charged with making an improper turn after two cars collided at Winston Churchill Boulevard and Sideroad 10 Friday morning. Police say a 1985 Ford Tempo driven by a Georgetown woman, 23, was southbound on Winston Churchill Boulevard when it turned left onto a private drive and was struck by a 1985 Mercury Lynx driven by a Georgetown man, 20. Police report no injuries in the accident.


pressure, you cannot give blood... we're looking after the donor as well as the receiver."

Although the new questioning system will mean longer line-ups when donors give blood, it is a measure necessary to protect the health of those concerned, said Mrs. Street.




