Municipalities want returns for fight

Halton Region may have to hand over as much as \$4 million of taxpayers' money to pay for the costs of various groups which fought the Region's proposed new landfill

Four groups have indicated they want money from the Region and the City of Burlington also wants remuneration for its costs if the other groups are awarded money, said Halton's chief administrative officer John Fleming Wednesday.

The town of Milton wants about \$1.25 million, National Sewer Pipe wants \$664,000, the Milton Area Citizens Coalition wants \$278,000 and the Burlington Ratepayers Association wants \$224,000. Although the City of Burlington has not filed for costs, estimated at about \$1.5 million, the city wants






