Atoms prime for playoff

Georgetown's Century 21 Major Atoms ended their regular season recently by losing a close game to Stoney Creek 3-2.

Both teams were evenly matched and provided spectators with exciting hockey action highlighted by close checking and end-to-end rushes.

Paul Sandifer put the local club in the lead early in the first period on a pass from Sandy Davidson.

Stoney Creek tied the score midway through the first period and took the lead 2-1 on a quick goal in the first minute of play in the second period.

Georgetown fought back and stormed the Stoney Creek net for the remainder of the period. Their hard work was rewarded when David Kotsos tied the score at 2-2 on a pass from Fraser Thom with 1:05 remaining in the period.

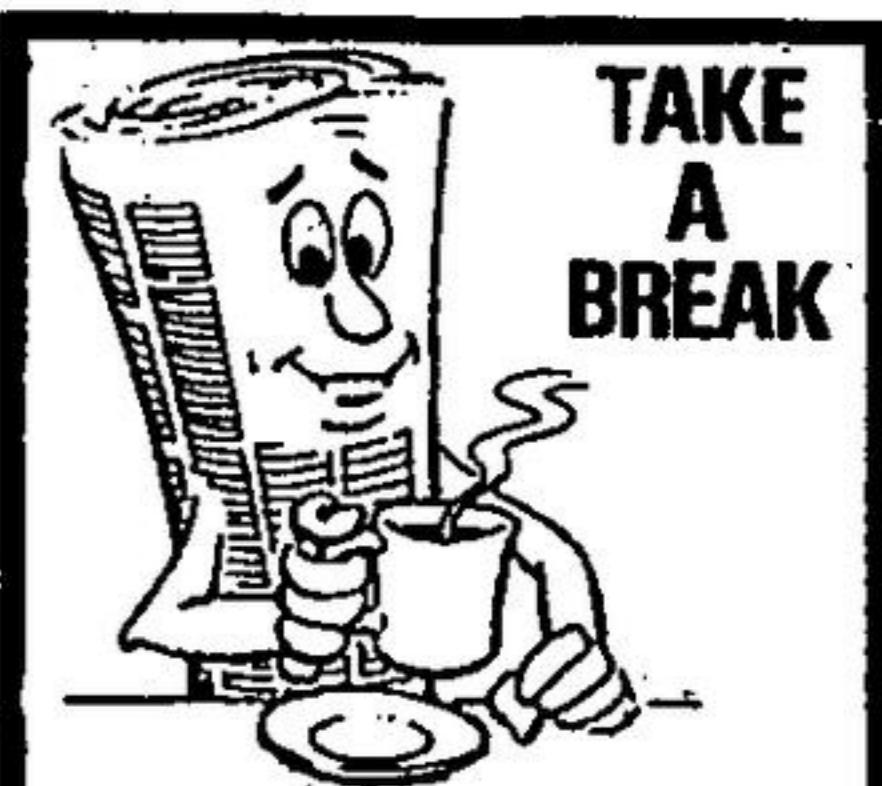
Burlington battled back in the third period to narrow the

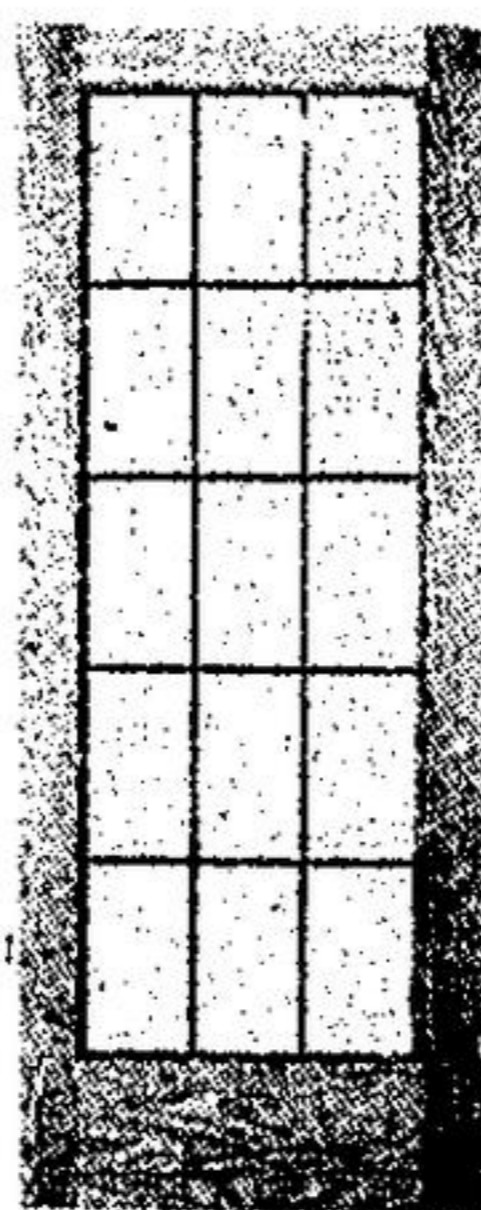

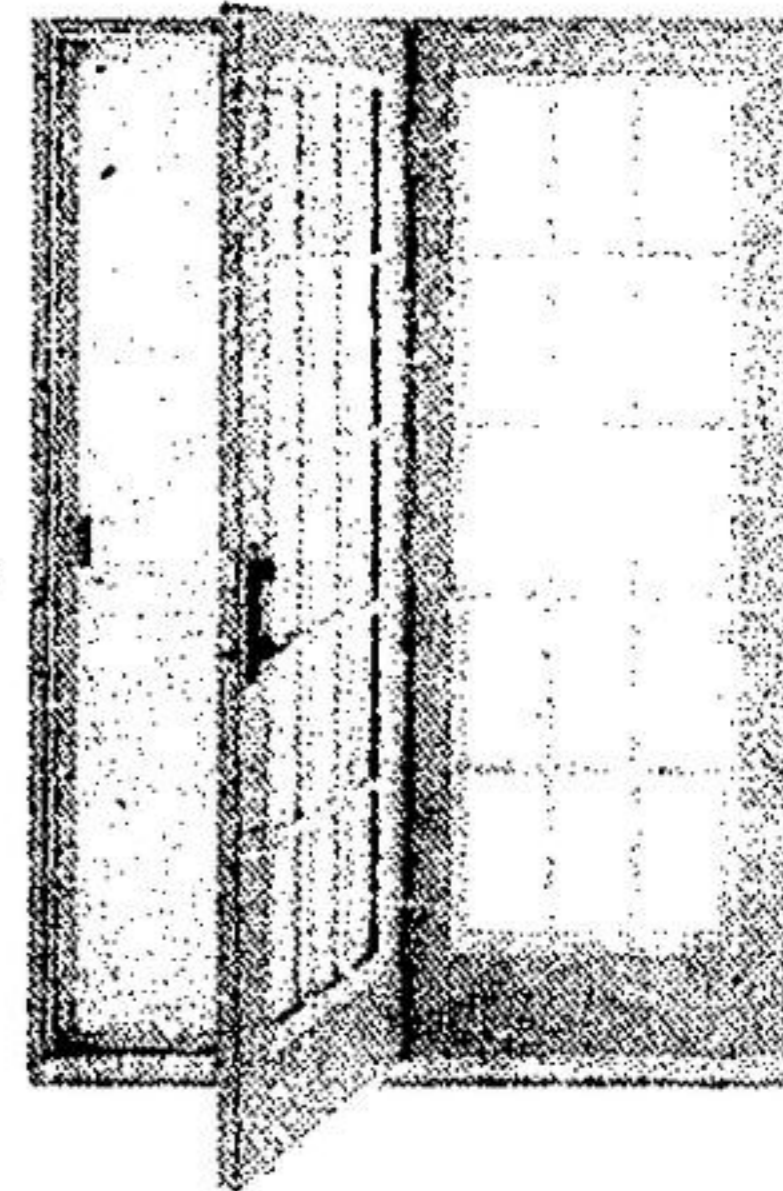

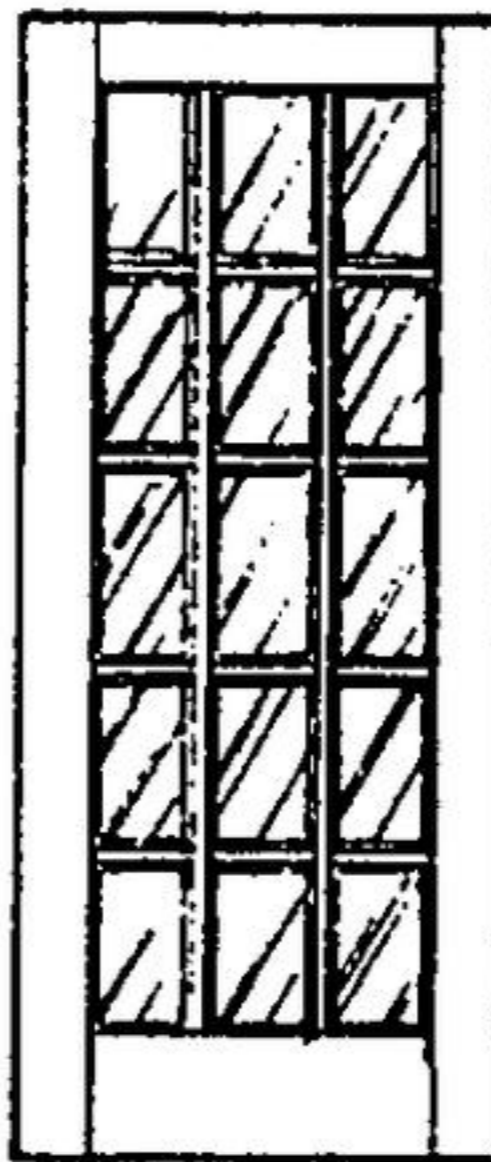
