Restaurant robber tracked

Halton Regional Police and Crime Stoppers are looking for the gunman who robbed the manager of the Bonanza Restaurant at Plains Road, Burlington, in May, 1988.

At 11:50 p.m. on Monday, May 23, 1988, a lone suspect armed with a small handgun entered the Bonanza Restaurant by an insecure rear door, and held up the manager in the office. The suspect ordered the manager to put cash into a green sports bag which he had brought with him. The gunman then pulled the phone cord from the wall and fled the building the same way he entered, by the rear door.

The suspect is described as male, white, 25 to 30 years old, medium build, 178 cm (5-ft. 10-in.), 80 kg (180-pounds), with shoulder-length brown hair,

wearing light colored blue jeans, and jean jacket, multi-colored "T-shirt", a red baseball style cap with white lettering.

The purpose of the expansion of the Georgetown water supply is to increase the availability of the water supply to accommodate the additional growth proposed within the Town of Halton Hills (Georgetown). Potential sites have been identified through a test drilling program in 1987.

A public information forum will be held from 5:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. on Wednesday, February 15, 1989 in the Committee Room at the Town of Halton Hills Administration Offices on Trafalgar Road regarding the above mentioned project to be conducted in accordance with the requirement of the Class Environmental Assessment for Municipal Water and Sewer Projects.
