The Georgetown Weldwood Pee wee "B" hockey team did not play too well in an exhibition game against the Swiss Chalet team from Chinguacousy recently.

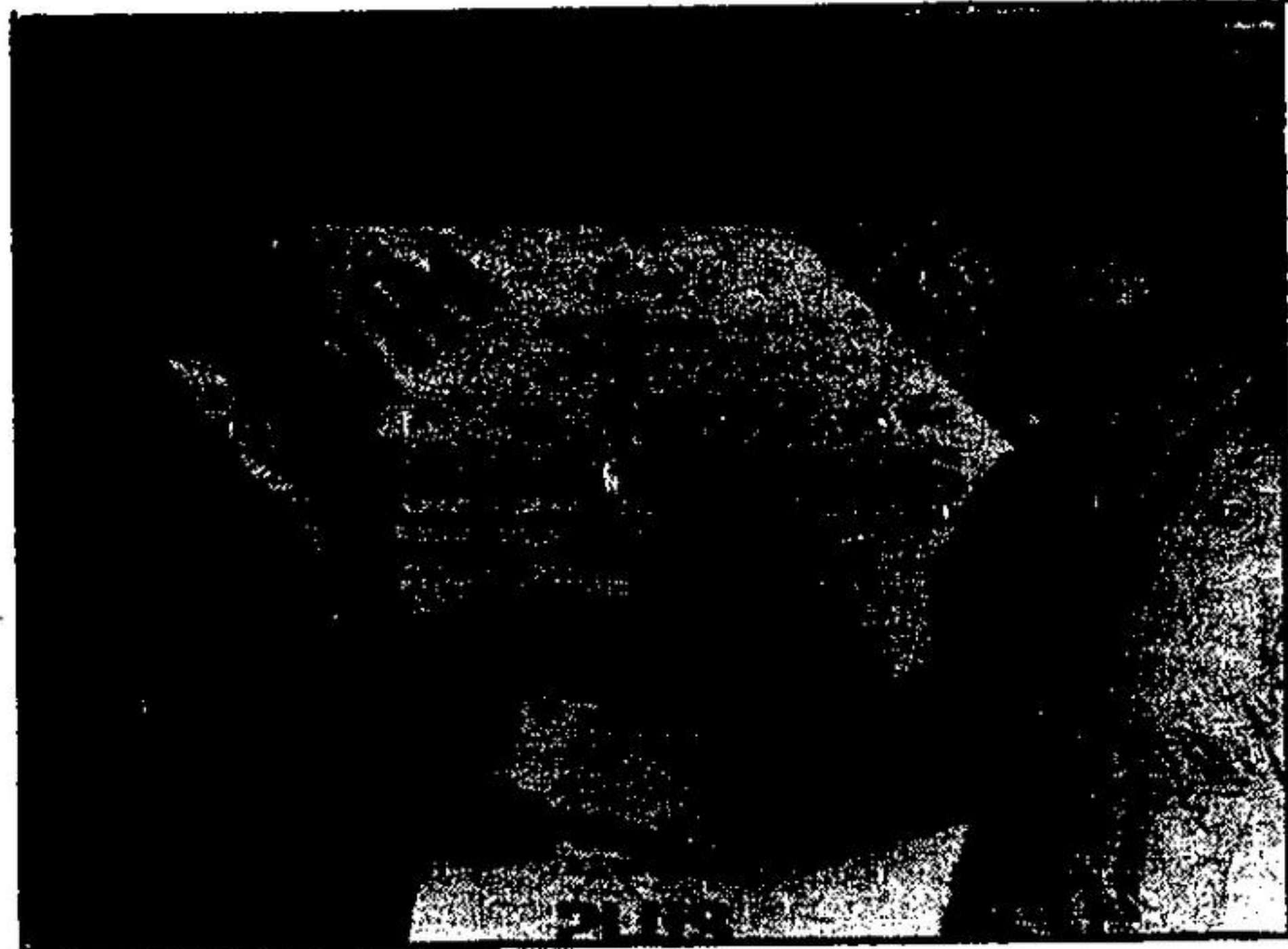
The long layoff and inactivity showed as Ching ran-up a 4-0
