The male lead, Dan, for this production is being played by Robert McCarron, a Bramalea native, born and raised. Robert has a broad range of experience in pantomime, drama, straight comedy and musicals. When asked why he liked to act, Robert replied that when he was younger he always wanted to do lots of different things and acting allows you to do these things because you are a different person every time you take on a new role. The enjoyment of the applause is certainly a plus as well. He doesn't think that the character of Dan is crazy or insane, just angry and confused. Dan knows too much of what he is doing to be insane. Robert finds this to be a challenging role because he is trying to learn an accent as well as his lines, blocking and emotions and he will be ready to go on when the play opens this week.

Jacky Willows has been painting in the final details on the backdrops and making the false beams for the set as well as attending rehearsal for her part as Dora, the maid. Ron Hunt is another busy person, looking after the general box office, helping to construct the set and acting in the play as Inspector Belsize.
