Bowlers rolling for National honors

Georgetown bowlers are again in the hunt for national honors.

The first step was to qualify in the local round. Now, the junior boys team have captured the second step - the zone championship. This team will now be prepping for the third step - the provincial championship - with their eyes set on the fourth step, the national championship crown.

On Saturday, Feb. 18, the team quickly established its bid by intimidating 13 other teams in the central Ontario zone playoffs. Ryan Martin with his 259 set the stage for Paul Burgess' hammer blow, a 291, for a team score of 1042 flat. Ryan continued with 205 and 214. Thus, Alain Larocque highlighted the event with three strikes in the tenth frame for a 266. The remaining two bowlers, Mark Reaume and David Leslie just worked to maintain their own average and keep their team in contention. It was a sad day for Brampton to again come second to the local boys in the junior division, especially on their home lanes. After a 10-day rest, coach Gord Lane says the boys will start some intensive work to polish up some rough spots and so will be in

great shape for Mar. 19, the day of the Youth Bowling Council's Provincials in Toronto.

The senior Georgetown girls team, a young team in its formative year, made a creditable showing by placing in the top five. This team of Shari Loke, Kathy Miller, Carrie Walsh, Christina Lane and Kim Arundell was competing against experienced graduating bowlers. They still managed to finish with more than 200 pins over their team average. The expertise of coach Andy Parent says that if they stay together, Georgetown senior girls will again produce provincial and national medals.

The '89 junior girls team is also the youngest to represent Georgetown in many years. Their effort was a learning experience as it produced them a fifth place standing out of 14 teams, and was just 63 pins shy of third place. This team of Cindy Clarke, Julie Lounds, Sharon Shapcott, Kerry

Wright and Robin Zander was coached by Carolyn Lane.

The Georgetown senior boys team, expecting great results, ended playing with players with back problems and winter virus taking its toll. However, they still finished in the top five bracket. Led by coach Ralph Miller, the members were Brian Bell, Alex Bertrand, Robert Harrison, David Ridley and Scott Hobbs.

The next weekend will see the completion of the remaining divisions in the zone finals. The bantam girls team will compete on Saturday, Feb. 25 at Georgetown Bowl at 2 p.m.
