Rebels squashed in challenge

On Sunday, Feb. 11, an inter-school competition was held between the Georgetown and District High School team and the team from St. Roberts in Markham.

At stake was the Jahinger Khan High School Challenge Cup, which Georgetown has held for three years.

The six local participants were Jim Dieroff, Keith Smith, Karen Smith, Andrew Hoddinott, Greg Sinclair and Kristy Lewis.

Sinclair and Lewis each won 3-0 playing in positions five and six. Hoddinott lost his match 2-3 in the most exciting match of the day, losing the fifth game by a 10-8 score.

Keith Smith and Karen Smith, playing at two and three, lost to their opponents but made them struggle for every point in the process.

Number one, Jim Dieroff, had the impossible task of trying to beat Duncan Peake, currently ranked number two in Canada in the Under-16's.

Although Jim lost 3-0, he came close to winning the second game with excellent serves and volleys. Thus, the team lost by a score of 2-4 and are looking forward to a rematch in March.

Fifteen-year-old Kristy Lewis will be playing in the provincial final of the Martini Challenge Charity Tournament, in the Novice category, on Saturday, Feb. 25 at the Mayfair Parkway Club in Scarborough. She became the regional winner by defeating three opponents, each by 3-0 scores.

Fifteen-year-old Melanie Jans tested her strength in the Under-19 Girls Ottawa and District Tournament, held Feb. 10-12, and came second in the round robin tournament. Melanie is a candidate for the four-member Junior Ladies' Team which will represent Canada at the World Championships to begin Aug. 28, in New Zealand.

She was one of four junior girls on a team which completed a two-week tour of Sweden and Germany, Jan. 21-Feb. 4.

Six Rebels grapple GHAC's

Six Georgetown grapplers will carry the colors of GDHS into GHAC wrestling competition tomorrow following a successful Rebel outing at the Halton finals last Thursday in Oakville.

Led by the first-place finishes of Bill Murphy (119-pound class) and Rob Veltman (149) the Rebels placed five wrestlers in the top four of their respective divisions.

Jamie Faccini (127) placed third in his weight class while Keith Perkins (119) and Martin Salt (149) both finished fourth. A fifth Georgetown wrestler, 104-pound Keith Smith, will also accompany the Rebels to GHAC as he qualified when another competitor was disqualified under an eligibility ruling. Smith had finished fifth in his division.

Another Rebel grappler, Peter Power (127), just narrowly miss-

ed earning a GHAC berth when he lost his final two bouts of the day after going 5-0 in his first five fights.

"I was really pleased with them all," said Rebel coach Ken Castledine. The mat mentor feels both Murphy and Veltman should be strong candidates for OFSAA.

"Barring any misfortune, Bill and Rob should be in shape for OFSAA," he said.

Tomorrow's GHAC competition takes place at Westdale Collegiate in Hamilton with the OFSAA finals set for Kingston's Royal Military College on Mar. 1-3.

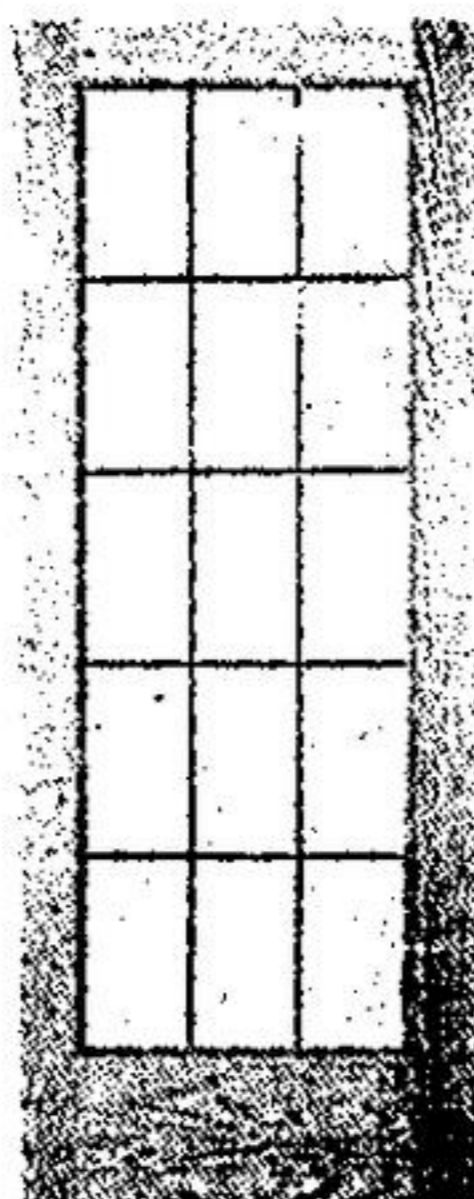

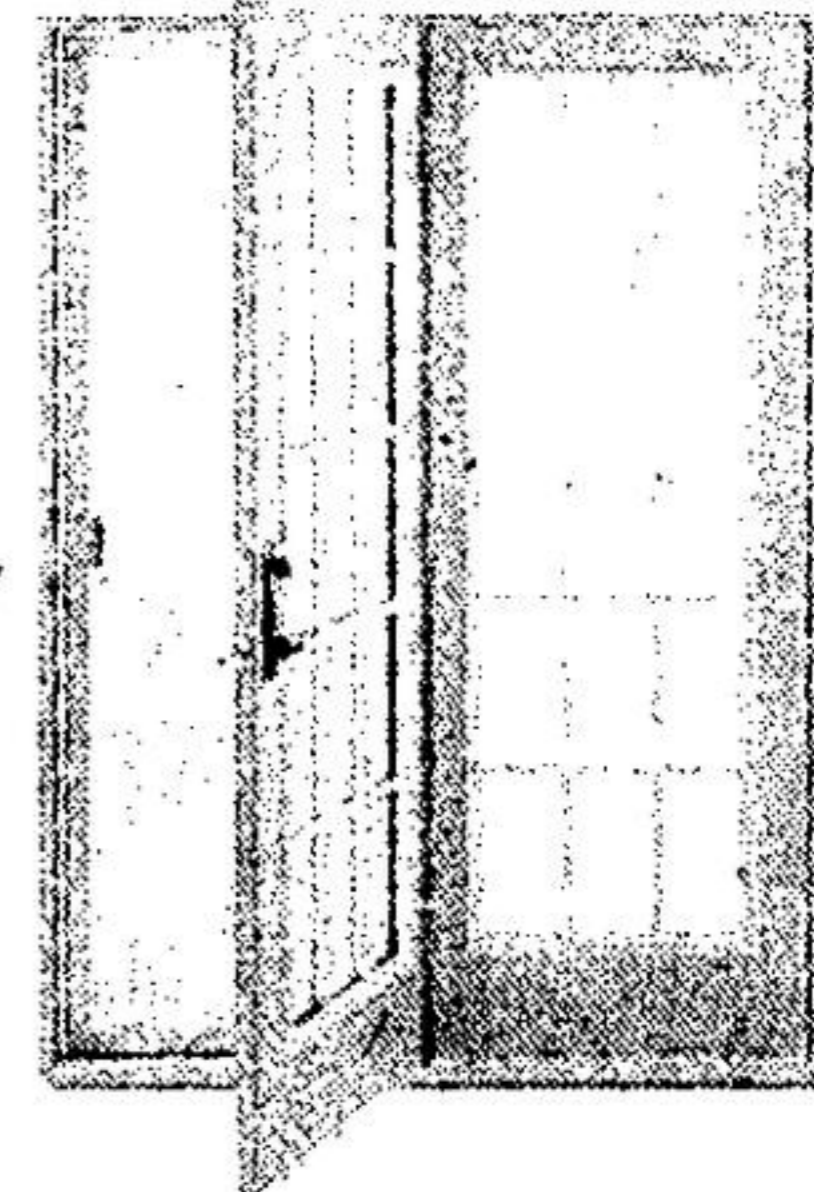

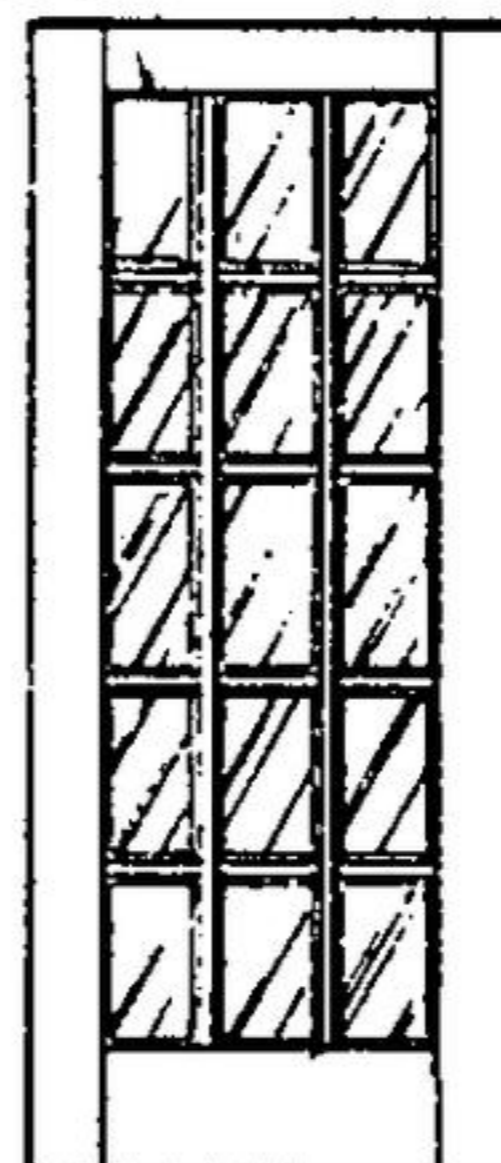
