



MAKE A RAINBOW!

You don't have to wait until the sun shines while it's raining to see a rainbow. You can make your own. Here's how.

1. On a sunny day go outside and fill a small bowl with water. Set a small mirror into the bowl so that the sun shines on the mirror.

2. Hold up a sheet of white paper so the sun shining on the mirror will reflect on to Polly: The teacher says I have to the paper. Hold the paper very still and you will see the rainbow colors on your paper.
