

Region told to step up recycling program

Halton Region has been told it should increase its target recycling levels from 15 per cent to between 25 and 30 per cent of the municipal waste stream.

The Ministry of Environment and an engineering firm hired by Halton to examine its waste disposal services say the Region should be aiming for the 25-per cent recycling target as early as 1992.

In its submission to the Consolidated Board hearings looking into the Regional landfill issue recently, Halton set a 16-per-cent recycling goal up to the year 2008.

This year, with the new recycling plant in Oakville operating and blue box recycling programs in full swing in all four municipalities, Halton expects to recycle 16 per cent of the municipal waste

stream.

The new recycling recommendations were revealed recently in a study conducted by the Region to identify possible energy from waste technologies and sites for future use in Halton.

The first phase of the report, entitled Evaluation of Alternatives, is expected to be completed later this year, with identification of possible EFW technologies and sites within Halton made to Regional Council sometime in the summer.

Halton made a commitment to energy from waste during the recent Consolidated Board Hearings. The Region wants to burn 50 per cent of the municipal waste stream for 12 of the 20 years the new landfill site is in operation, starting in 1996.

The Evaluation of Alternatives document is the preliminary

stages of the lengthy Environmental Assessment process.

But Milton Councillor Bill Johnson thinks the report is a "waste of time." He's angry at the slow pace of the Region in its quest for an EFW plant. "I want an EFW plant in Milton. I've been pushing for one for about 10 years. You're not going to get one through this process," he said during a planning and public works committee meeting last week.

The first phase of the search, which includes extensive public consultation, will only serve to make "more people aggravated and upset for a longer period of time," he said.

Coun. Johnson wants to set up a technical committee consisting of

experts in the energy from waste field to study technologies which would be appropriate for Halton.

During the public consultation process, residents rarely give input but instead merely object to the proposal if it is located anywhere near them, he said.

"I've gone through this exercise in the quarry in Acton," said Coun. Johnson, who was the chairman of the public information hearings held last summer and fall. "Nobody's there to approve it.

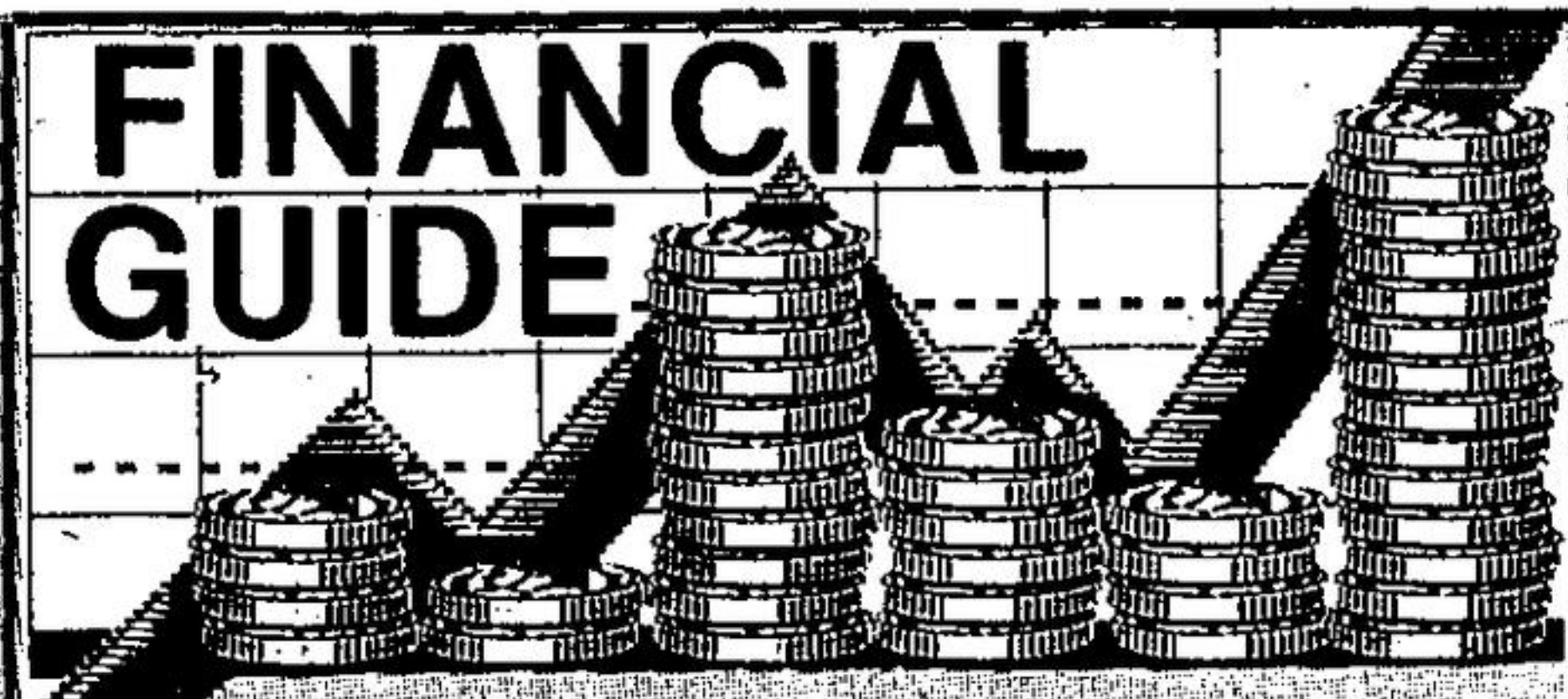

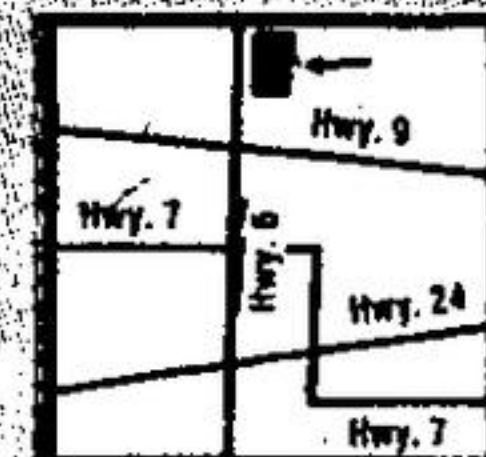
