Police will not lay charges in the accident.

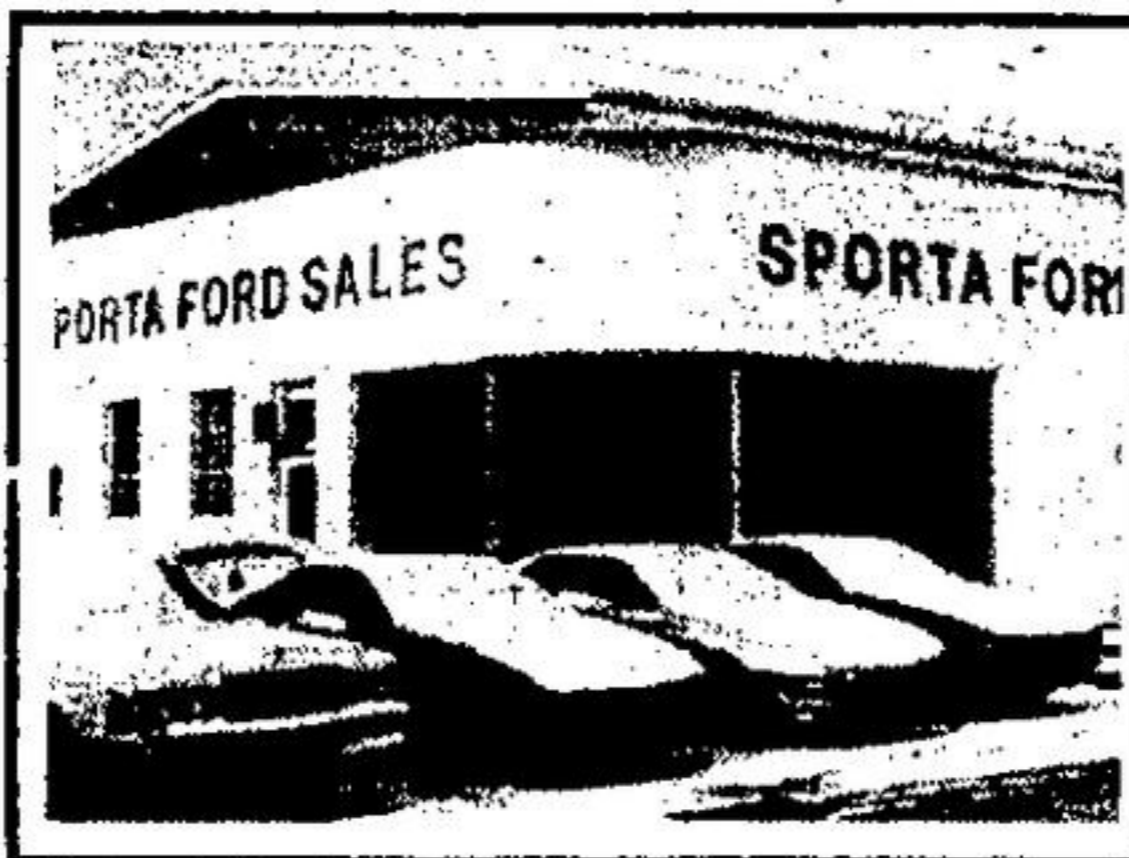
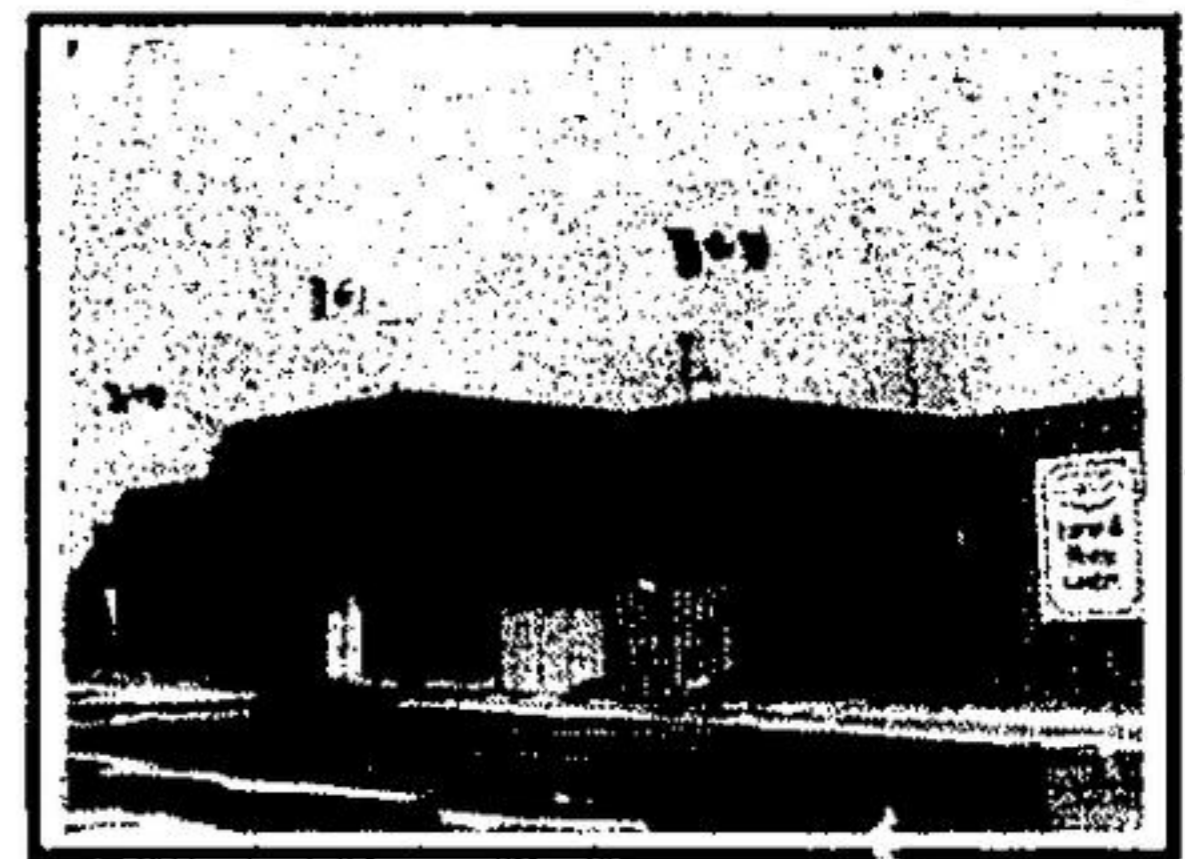
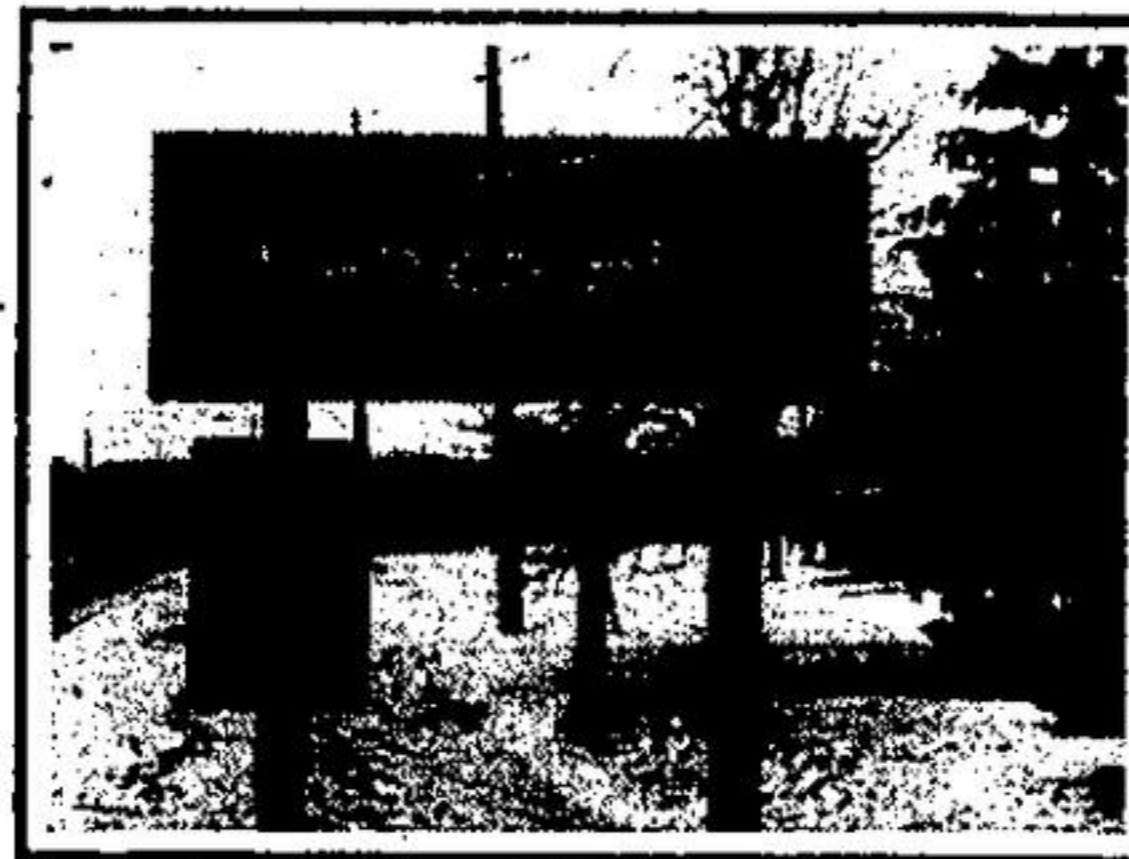
