

Georgetown undefeated in tri-county

# Atoms looking to repeat

Coach Jim Lahey's Georgetown Century 21 Major Atom hockey team remains undefeated after four tri-county games as they attempt to repeat as last year's tri-county champions.

Tim Diardichuk led the Major Atoms to a recent 5-0 victory over Chinguacousy with two quick goals in the first period. Coach Lahey placed Diardichuk on left wing to start the game hoping that Tim's size would unbalance the Chinguacousy club. Lahey's strategy paid off as Diardichuk scored his first goal 41 seconds into the game. Brad Spears assisted on Tim's second goal late in the first period.

After a scoreless second period, Marc Boucher increased the margin to three goals on a pass from David Kotsos. Brad Spears then earned his second point of the game slapping in a pass from Fraser Thom on the point position.

Scott Truman ended the Georgetown scoring with a nifty goal shot into the top right hand

corner of the Chinguacousy goal after receiving a pass from Scott Lahey.

In Brampton the Century 21's faced a much-improved Brampton team. Both teams kept the spectators on the edge of their seats with end-to-end rushes, close checking and tough defensive play. Brampton took the lead in the first period and remained leading until Brad Spears scored on a pass from Tim Diardichuk and Paul Sandifer midway through the second period.

Brampton again took the lead in the third period but Paul Sandifer evened the score on a pass from Kevin Lumb and Tim Diardichuk.

With 5:21 remaining in the third period Fraser Thom took a pass from Andrew Trant and drove a shot past the Brampton goaltender to give Georgetown a 3-2 win.

Three nights later the 21's travelled to Dundas and met a determined Dundas team that refused to quit. Although Georgetown dominated the game play, they were unable to score. It was not until half way through the second period that Scott Lahey

slammed in a pass from Sandy Davidson to give Georgetown a 1-0 lead. David Kalbarski increased the lead to 2-0 in the third period on a pass from Brad Spears. Dundas cut the lead to 2-1 with a late period goal but were unable to get the equalizer.

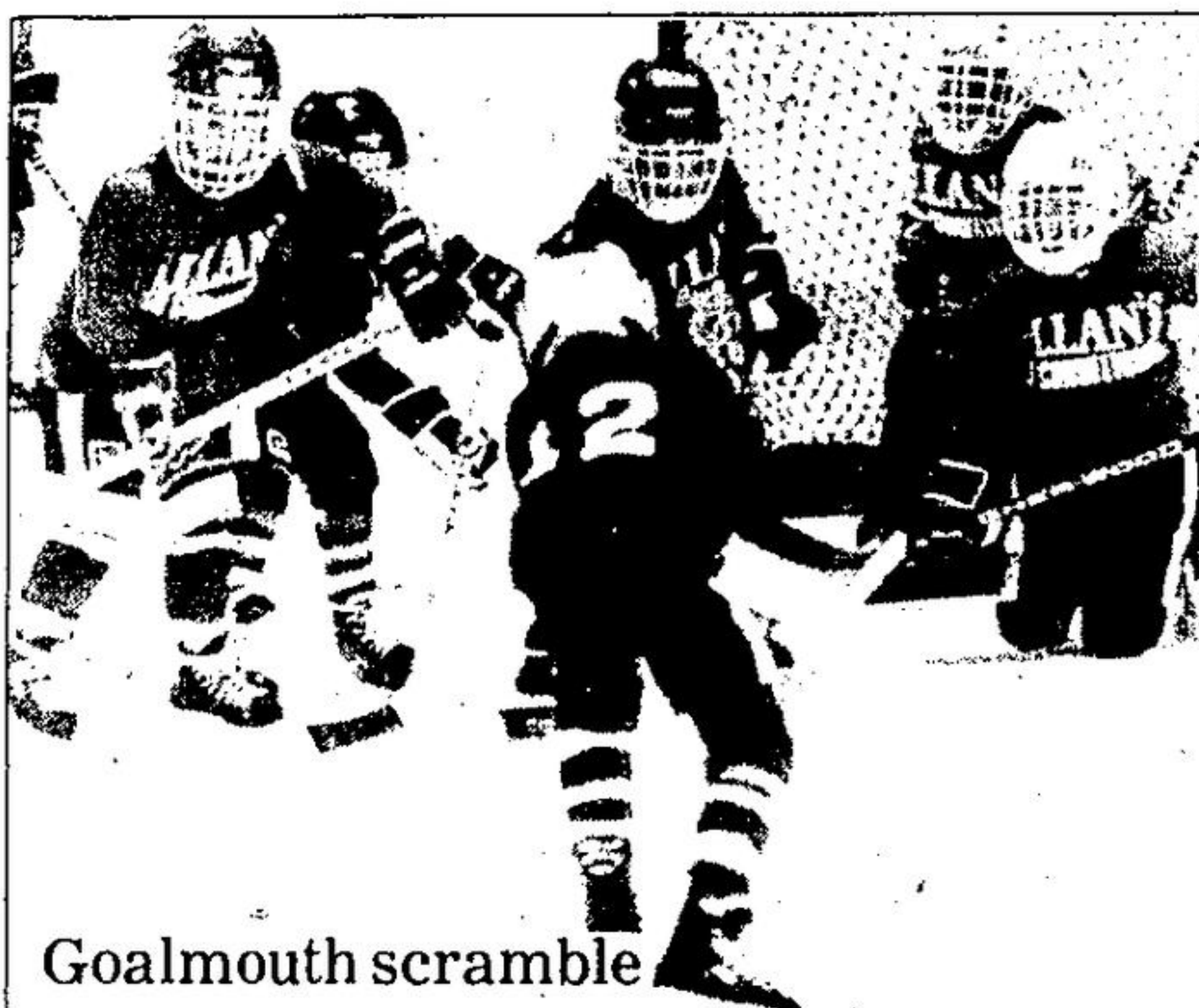
On Mar. 9, local fans were again treated to another hard-fought game between Georgetown and Brampton at Memorial Arena.

Brampton jumped into the lead with three minutes remaining in the first period. They held on to their lead until the six-minute mark in the second period when David Kotsos scored on a pass from Marc Boucher. Four minutes later Boucher put the Georgetown club into the lead 2-1 on a pass from David Kotsos and David Boere. The remainder of the period saw tight checking and exciting play.

Shortly into the third period Fraser Thom increased the 21's lead to 3-1 on a shot from the point position. David Boere assisted on the play. Brampton fought back and decreased the Georgetown margin to 3-2 with just four minutes remaining.

A goal by Scott Lahey, assisted by David Kalbarski and Scott Truman, with only two and one half minutes left gave Georgetown a two-goal cushion and dashed Brampton's hopes of victory.

The Century 21 Major Atoms face Dundas and Stoney Creek after the Spring Break. If they are successful in both games they will play in the championship game during the last week in March.
