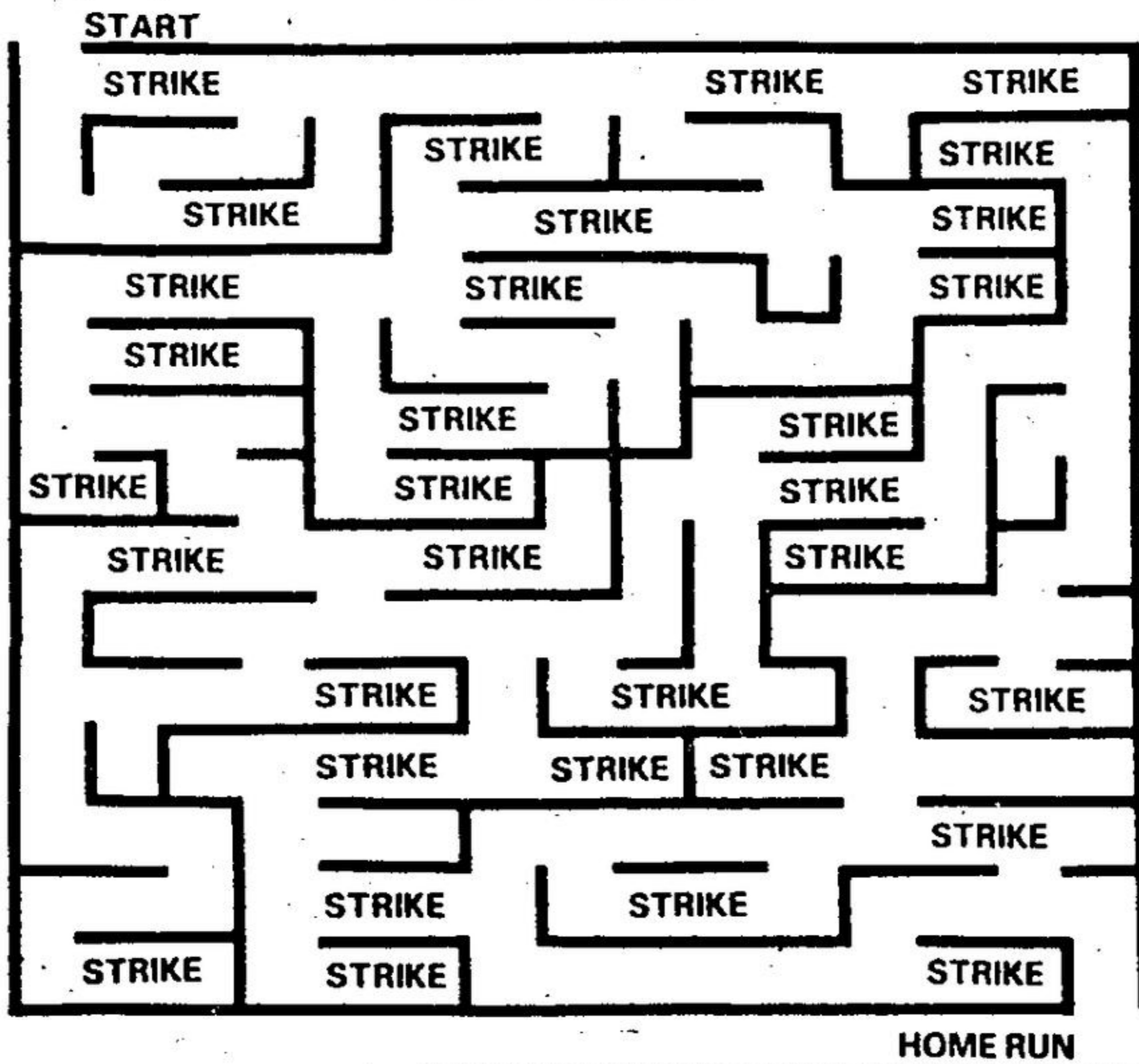

## A HOME RUN!

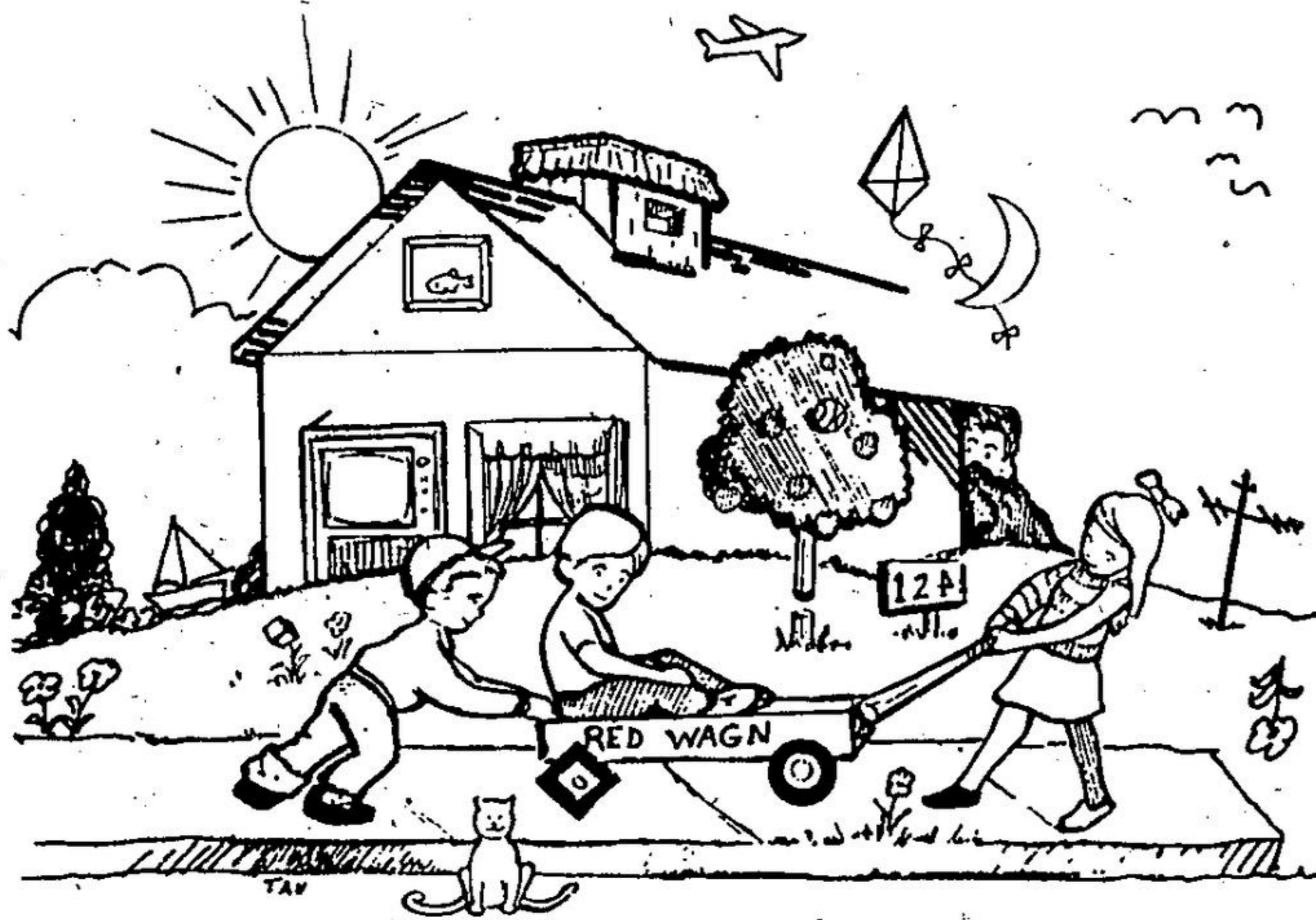

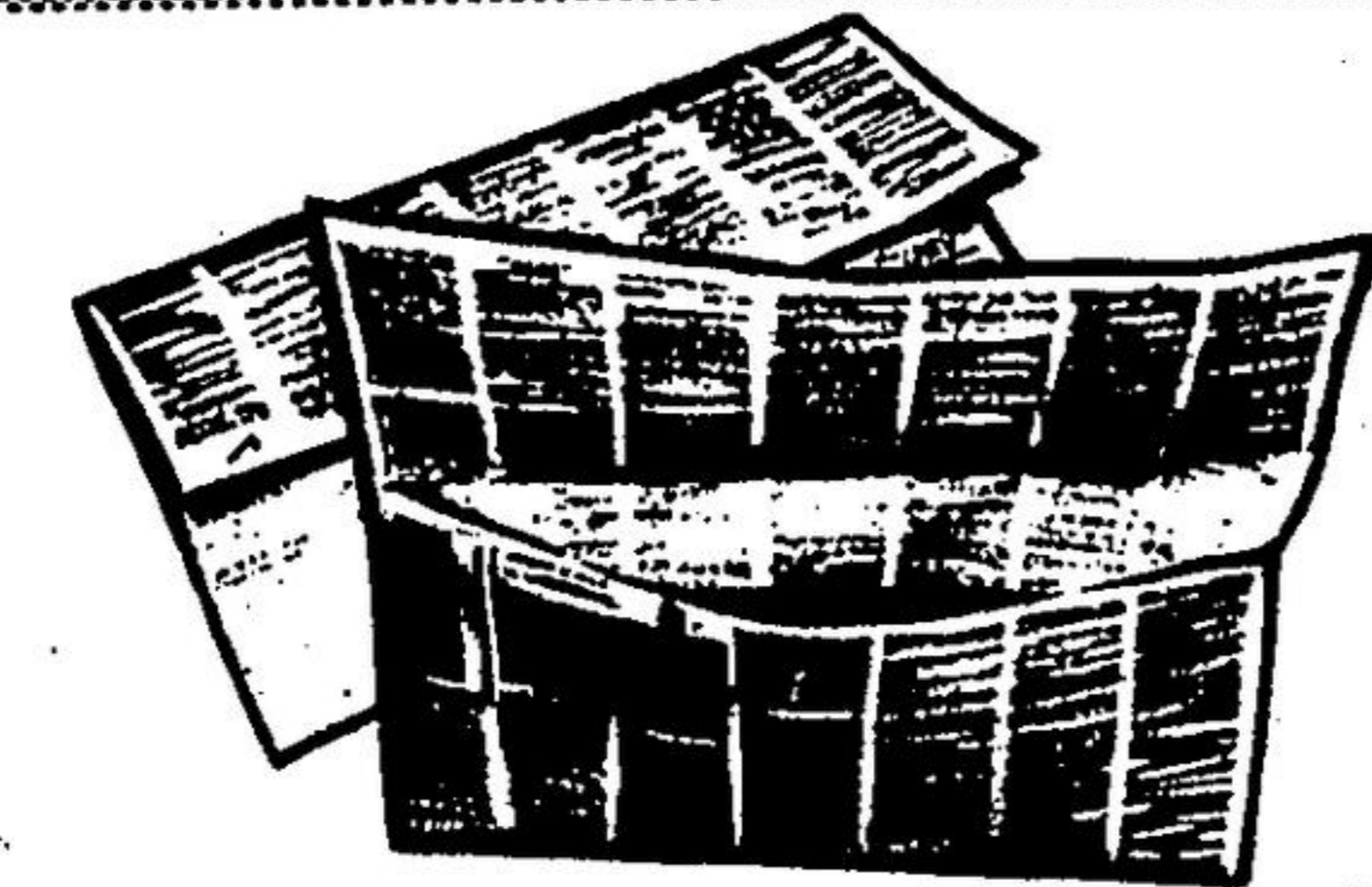
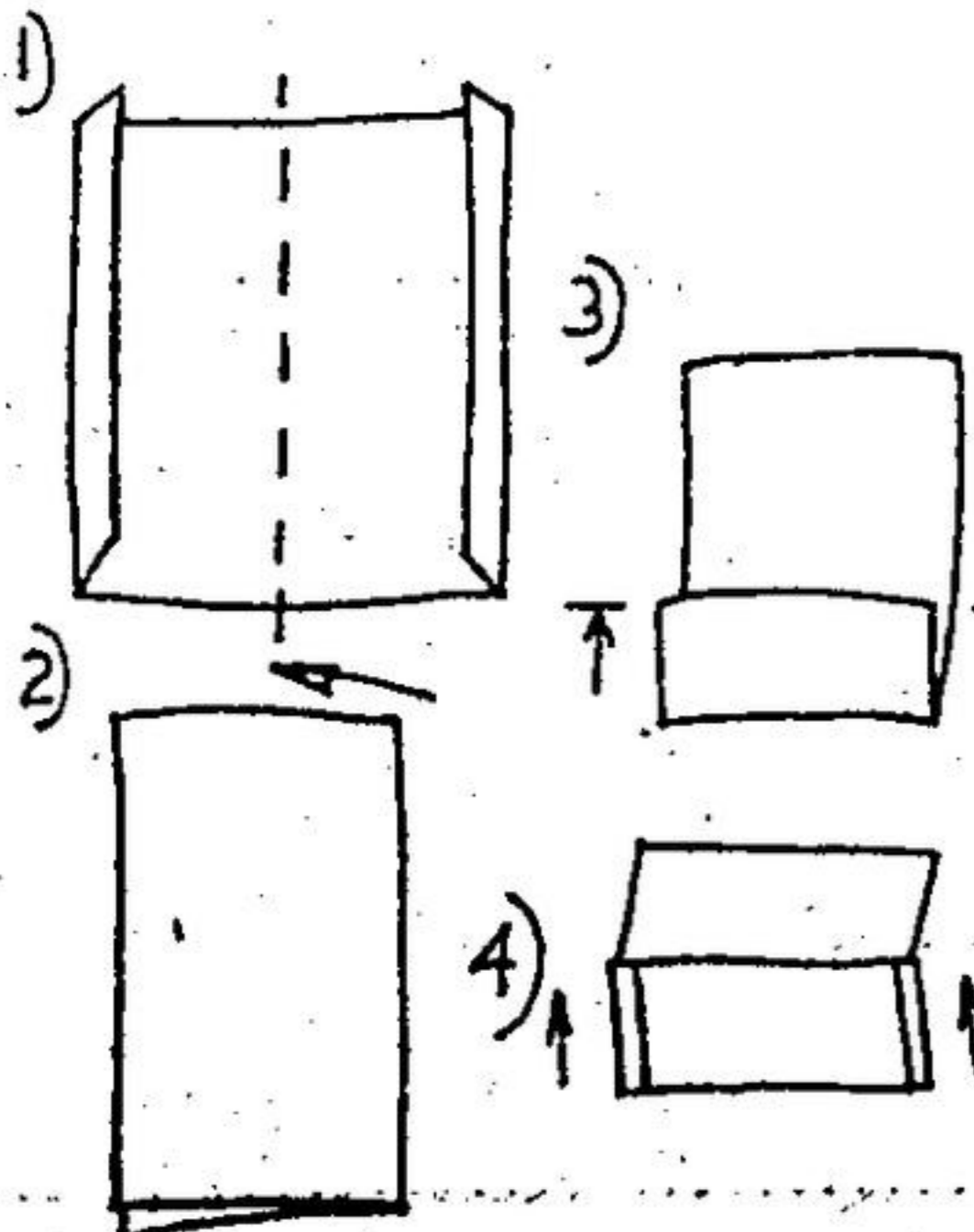


## MANY MISTAKES

Follow the directions to make this fun and easy **NEWSPAPER FOLDER**.



1. Find a newspaper page that has small uniform column widths (classified ads, stock market).
2. Tape or glue this page on top of two more pages.
3. Using the outside column widths as guidelines, fold the outside edges in one column width. Tape down folds.
4. Fold the top and bottom edges in about 2 inches. Tape down folds.
5. Fold the newspaper page in half on its original vertical fold.
6. Bring the bottom edge to the center line. Fold again. Then glue, tape or staple the sides.
7. Fold the top edge down.
8. You can decorate this folder with paints, crayons, felt-tipped markers or colored paper, or you might like to leave it just as it is.
