## Halton Hills council stays out of dispute

Halton Hills councillors will have nothing to do with a battle between the Toronto Sun and Metro Toronto.

The town received a letter from Metro last week describing that Region's battle with the Toronto daily newspaper over a controversial column written by McKenzie Porter on Feb. 6. The letter, which was sent to all municipalities in Ontario with a population of more than 20,000, includes Metro's formal motion objecting to Mr. Porter's column. In the column, Mr. Porter says no one born outside Canada should be allowed to vote or run as a candidate in any elections.

Metro threatened to pull its advertising from the Sun and lodge a complaint with the Ontario Press

Council and the Human Rights Commission unless the Sun apologizes for the column.

Although the letter didn't include a request to endorse Metro's resolution, letters circulated to other municipalities are often intended to seek their endorsement.

Without a word, Halton Hills councillors simply voted to "receive" the letter but no motion to endorse it was put forward.

Jean Williamson introduced guest speaker Dianne Gray who spoke as her experiences as a security guard. Security guards receive special training to deal with many situations. They are responsible for the action of two groups of people. The staff are the internal group and the shoppers are the external group.

The guards walk the floor, and dress as a shopper in order to blend in. They find that amateurs take small articles. Teenagers often take clothing and tapes. Sixteen per cent of shoplifters are professionals, who steal for a living.

The guards work closely with the police, and testify in court.

Potential guidance and law courses in schools are important for preventing the theft problem.

Guards are also on the alert for any physical danger in a building, such as an alarm, power failure, or robberies. The need for security guards is an added expense for the retailer.

Mary Garbut thanked the speaker and presented her with a gift.
