Some of Toronto's garbage could be headed for the recently approved Milton landfill site under a contingency plan soon to be set down by a new alliance of Greater Toronto Area Regions.

The Regions of Metro Toronto, Halton, Peel, Durham and York formed an alliance to solve the area's impending garbage crisis last week. Metro Toronto is expected to run out of place to put its waste by 1992.

The idea is to ask for proposals from public and private enterprises to come up with waste disposal schemes for the entire area, Halton Chairman Pete

Pomeroy said.

In the meantime, the new organization will identify contingency sites to receive waste in a crisis situation.

The recently approved Milton site should be ready by 1992 but Mr. Pomeroy said that site could only take a small portion of Toronto's waste. Metro produces about three million tonnes of waste a year and the Milton site has a total capacity of five million tonnes.

However, no one is looking Miltoh's way right now, said Mr. Pomeroy. "I can safely say that at this point in time there isn't a site in Halton that is part of the contingency plan."

The new Greater Toronto Area

alliance will be taking a wait-andsee approach, Mr. Pomeroy said.

"There are people out there looking at single solution sites. We'll just issue a proposal call and see what comes back."

Municipalities or private firms could look at waste disposal as an industry, although Mr. Pomeroy said he is skeptical any municipality will welcome a massive landfill

The new alliance must be approved by the five Regional councils in order to take effect, but Mr. Pomeroy doesn't see any choice. "If we don't (resolve the issue) in a co-operative way someone will move in and it's going to be resolved for us."


