Police Beat

Suspected narcotic

A man possessing a vial of "suspected" hashish oil will appear in court May 8. Police say a search of five occupants in a car stopped on Trafalgar Road near Sideroad 15 for a traffic violation Sunday afternoon revealed that one occupant allegedly had a five-gram container of a suspected narcotic. An 18-year-old Arthur man has been charged in connection with the offence.

Theft charge

Police have charged a Georgetown male youth, 17, with the theft of a fishing reel from a Guelph Street department store March 17. A man entered the store and left without paying for the \$60 item, say police. The Georgetown youth will appear in court April 17.

Man charged

The theft of three razors and two packages of film valued at \$61 resulted in theft charges being laid against a Rexdale man, 25, last week. Police say a

suspect took the items without paying from a Guelph Street drug store March 15. The Rexdale man will appear in court April 17.

Police say the woman, 32, was stopped after she was allegedly seen driving in an erratic manner on Mountainview Road near Maple Avenue shortly before 2 a.m.

Why Does the Lining Wear Out First?

Consumers often notice that the hem, underarm, or cuff lining material is abraded while the outer fabric is in good condition. This occurs because the lining materials are often much thinner or sheerer than the outer fabric. In addition, many linings are constructed in a satin weave, which has floating yarns to give the fabric a high luster and sheen. These satin fabrics naturally wear much faster than tightly woven fabrics. Furthermore, the lining in the collar, cuffs, and hem are more susceptible to heavy soiling and abrasion, and soiled fabrics wear faster than clean ones. Finally, objects carried in the pockets can cause lining material to progressively wear thin in localized areas.
