### SPRING & EASTER BOOKS

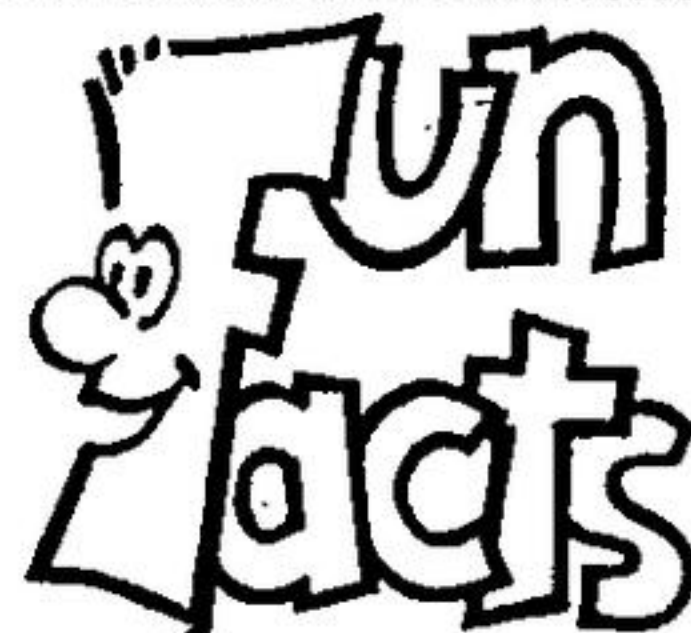

1. Spring, or the vernal equinox, officially begins at 10:28 a.m. Eastern Standard Time on March 20, 1989.

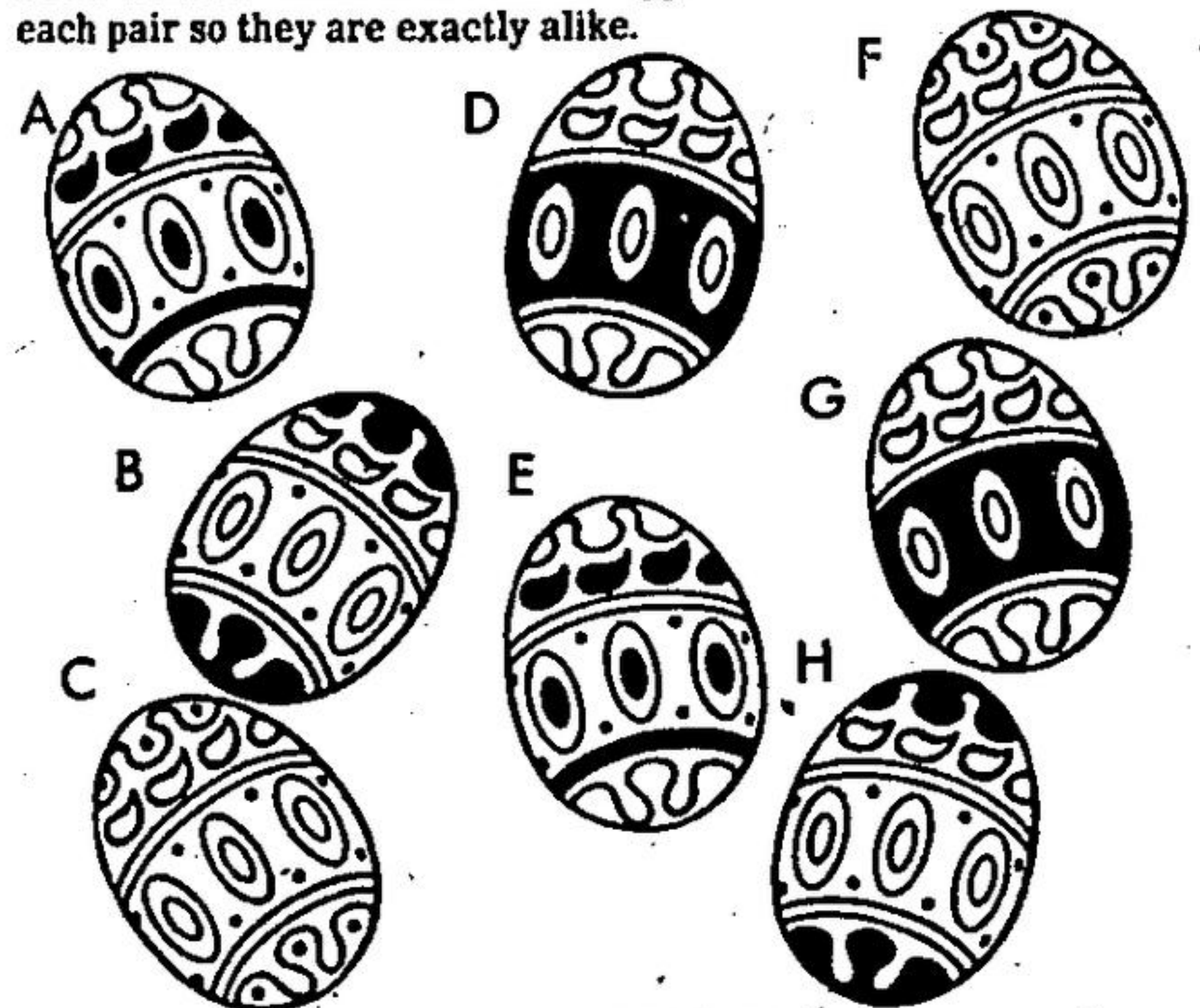
Jean: What do you get if the Jolly Green Giant steps on your house?

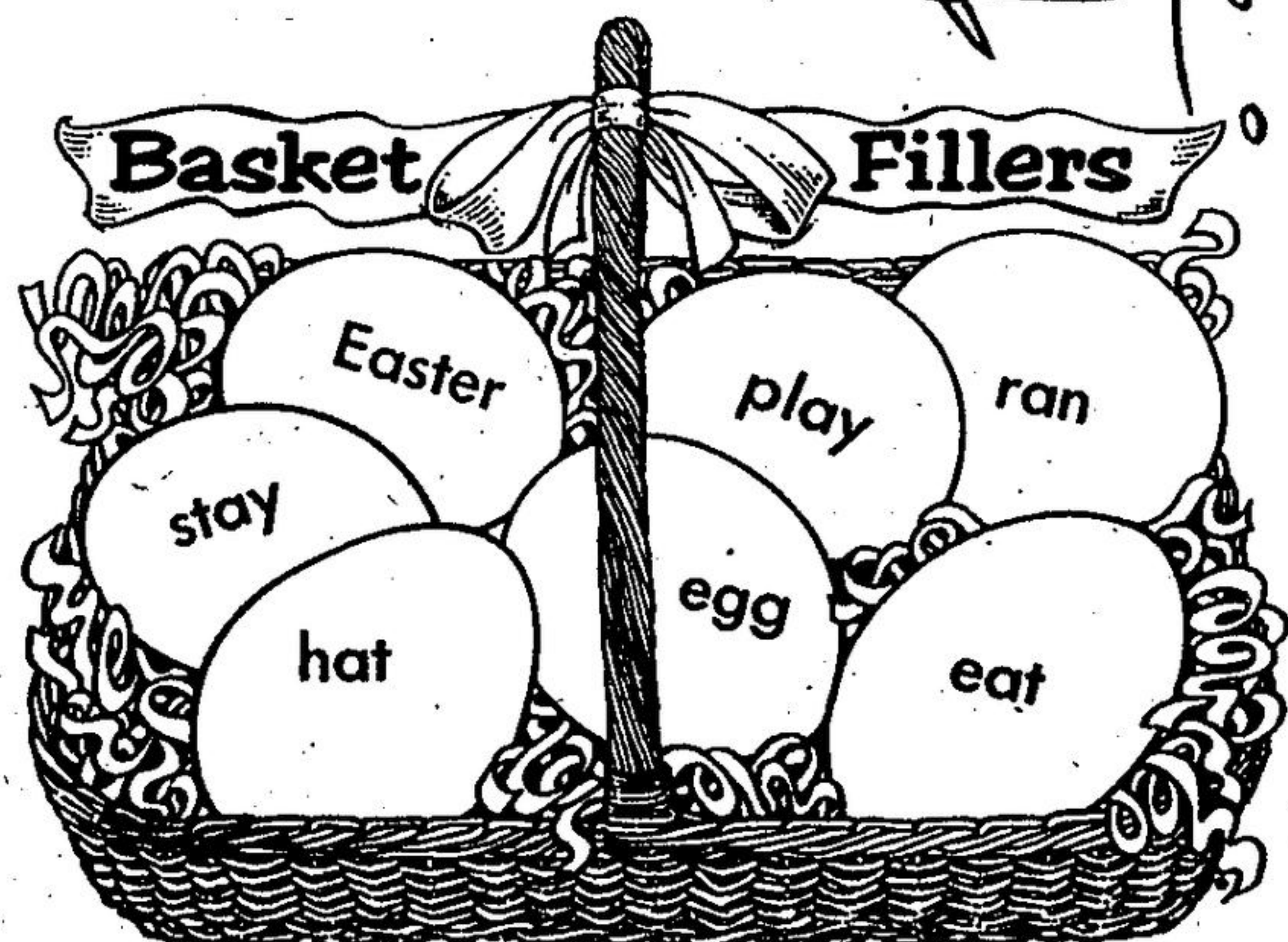
