

Cancer Society set to blitz Acton

Cancer Society members are preparing to hit the streets of Acton April 3 for the first ever Cancer Society blitz night in Acton.

Organizer Cathy McGillivray said all canvassers will meet at the Trinity United Church on Milli Street at 5 p.m. the night of April 3 for a light meal and a film on volunteering entitled "You Make" the Difference."

The canvassers will be hitting the streets at about 6 p.m.

"It is hoped that the majority of the canvassing will be completed. that evening but it is quite possible that canvassers will be out at other times during the month of April," said Ms. McGillivray.

The canvassers' meal will be donated by the Trinity Activity Group, a group of United Church women whose mandate includes outreach in the community as well as within their own church.

The Physically Handicapped Citizens Affiliation in North Halton will fold in June.

Past President Pat Woode said the decision to fold was made, following an unsuccessful appeal for more money to Halton Region on Wednesday.

The affiliation asked for \$13,000 in operating costs from the Region. in order to finish compiling a computerized data base. The affiliation was given a \$16,000 start-up grant from the province last year but the project is only half finished and the group can't get any more funding until the computer data base pro-

The group provides information and advocacy services to physically handicapped people.

Debrae Greenwood, a spokesperson for the affiliation, told Halton councillors Wednesday the group would have to fold in June unless the \$13,000 was approved.

The affiliation has applied for funding from local United Way organizations but no decision has yet been made on the request, said

. The affiliation is now looking for other organizations in North Halton who are interested in keeping the information the group has gathered so far, said Ms. Woode.


She doubts any other organization will be willing to take on the advocacy role the affiliation has assumed in the last few years.




