Returns excellent for heart fund

Funds are rolling in from the February Heart and Stroke Month campaign to the tune of \$52,000 in Halton Hills.

The Heart and Stroke Foundation of Ontario in Halton will reach its local \$23,000-goal and will surpass that goal with funds from a Jump for Heart fundraiser held in February, said a local organizer. An Aerobathon held at Work that Body in Georgetown raised \$24,500.

"The \$24,000 is totally above what we budgeted," said Foundation assistant co-ordinator for fundraising Mary Goodfellow. She said the annual Jump for Heart

event can be held any month but because it was in February, it boosted the donation total.

Other funds to meet the Foundation's goal will come from residential campaigns, business contributions and local drop boxes located in stores.

Although donations haven't been tallied for Acton, Georgetown donations reached almost \$14,000 last month and are expected to reach \$18,000. Funds will also come from the coin box donations. . .

Local business donations will be slower in arriving. Businesses were sent donation packages by

mail only three weeks ago, said Mrs. Goodfellow.

The Heart and Stroke Foundation uses 10 different areas of fundraising throughout the year. The Halton Hills' goal of \$23,000 for this year applies only to campaigns conducted as part of the February campaign.

Goals this year are higher than those for 1988. Last year, \$14,000 was collected from residential donors and just over \$2,000 came from local businesses.

The Heart and Stroke Foundation will have completed figures for this year's campaign by July 1.

"If we meet all our goals, we'll be very pleased," said Mrs. Goodfellow.
