The Rebel team will look toward its annual Rebel Classic Invitational meet at the end of April and all events afterward point to the June 2-3 all-Ontario championships in Etobicoke! "We should have a great team there," said Clarke.

Meanwhile, up the pike in Acton the Redmen are welcoming the largest track and field team they've had in five years. That according to co-coach Shelley Rogne.


