

High school track and field preview...

Numbers high for Rebels, Redmen

One of the things heralded by the onset of spring is the opening of the high school track and field season and Halton Hills is no exception to the rule.

Bevin Clarke will handle the reins of the GDHS Rebels track contingent in 1989 and he's excited about the upcoming season. "I'm really looking forward to the season," said Clarke last week. "We haven't lost many kids from last season, we've got a good nucleus back and a lot of new kids who are really keen."

Clarke's crew will start training in earnest this week with the first competition being the St. Michael's Snowball Relays on Apr. 7 in Toronto. Among the talented veterans coming back to the GDHS starting blocks this season is the 1988 junior girls 4 x 100 OFSAA bronze medal-winning team of Tara Burroughs, Anna Toone, Michele Thompson and Lisa Carter.

Other big names coming back include Sheri Nairn, Bob Donker, Rick Lane and Glen Mulder, who all saw success on the track in 1988.

Clarke will also look to the brother combination of Kevin and Mike Dyer as well as talented athletes Melanie Jans and Natalie Goldson to carry the Rebel colors into competition.

Clarke is as much pleased with the number of athletes who want to run track this year as he is by their calibre. "We had over 70 athletes to our first meeting," he enthused. "That will make my challenge more difficult, but I'm looking forward to it."

Talented newcomers include Kristy Lewis and junior football star Trevor Elinesky who should find work for the Rebels in sprint hurdles. Raider Jr. B rookie Trent Cull, who's likely to go high in next summer's Ontario Hockey League midget priority draft, looks to be a good bet in shot put. "I would expect him to be a medal winner at OFSAA," predicted Clarke.

The Rebels should also be strong in the boys 4 x 100 relays and 4 x 4 open relays.

Clarke will be handling the head coaching chores himself this year as former co-coaches Donna Metcalfe and Karen Cosgrove have decided to take this year off after several years in the track wars with GDHS teams.

Former Georgetown students Jay Anderson, currently studying physical education at Brock University, and Bob Anderson will be on hand to help Clarke as will GDHS vice-principal Joe Bray.

Meanwhile, up the pike in Acton the Redmen are welcoming the largest track and field team they've had in five years. That according to co-coach Shelley Rogne.

"We've got lots of Grade 9's out and some upcoming sprinters," said Rogne, who'll handle the coaching duties along with Bruce Andrews, Mitch Chuvale and Marg Shaller.

In the throwing department big things are expected from Lisa Sprostranov and Heather Willmott. Jen Martin, Kelly Ambrose and Deanna Louth are also potential contributors.

"The efforts of Donna and Karen will certainly be missed," said Clarke. "But we'll pick up the slack. It should be a great season."

The Rebel team will look toward its annual Rebel Classic Invitational meet at the end of April and all events afterward point to the June 2-3 all-Ontario championships in Etobicoke. "We should have a great team there," said Clarke.
