

What they'll also get to see, is a group 'Arnesen also skated strongly of polished medal-winners. while missing the medal round.

Four skaters from the Georgetown club returned from the Western Ontario Section Winter Invitational Competition in Samia on Mar., 10-12 with a handful of medals after turning in impressive performances at the international meet.

Danielle Dembie, Tara Hart, Lesley Watson and Rosie Gimeno

were part of a six-skater contingent from Georgetown that claimed positions in the top three spots of their respective competitions. Two other Georgetown skaters, Joanna Miller and Sarah

Dembie picked up a gold medal in the freeskate and added a bronze in elements; Hart had silver in elements and bronze in freeskate; and Watson picked up bronze in elements and shared a gold medal with partner Rosie Gimeno in the similar pairs event.

Miller narrowly missed climb-

ing the medal podium with a fourth-place finish while Arnesen finished eighth in her category.

Over 1,000 skaters from Canada and the USA competed in the weekend event which was sanctioned by both the Canadian Figure Skating Association and its U.S. counterpart.

The 27th annual figure skating carnival starts today and runs through tomorrow at Memorial Arena.

Lawnbowling starts soon


