

Man charged

A Georgetown man, 73, was charged by Halton Regional Police with making an improper turn following a two-car collision in Georgetown Thursday afternoon. Police say the 1961 Pontiac driven by the Georgetown man struck a 1985 Pontiac driven by a Georgetown man, 18. Neither driver was injured.

Two-car collision

A car driven by an Acton man was severely damaged in a collision Thursday afternoon in Acton. Police say a northbound 1981 Ford travelling through the intersection at Queen Street and Churchill Road in Acton, was struck by a westbound 1983 Pontiac 'driven by a Georgetown woman, 33. The driver of the Ford, an Acton man, 18, is charged with failing to stop. Police report no injuries in the collision.

Charges laid

A car making a left turn was struck by a 1987 Honda driven by a Mississauga man Monday afternoon. Police say the Honda was eastbound on Guelph Street near Mountainview Road when it was struck by a 1982 Ford driven by a Georgetown woman, 32. The Mississauga man is charged with failing to yield the right of way. Police report no injuries in the collision.

Impaired charge

Halton Regional Police charged an Acton man with impaired driving after his truck landed on a Willow Street resident's front lawn early Sunday morning. Police say an Acton man, 23, was sitting in the truck, allegedly in an impaired state. He will appear in court May 8.

Domestic dispute

Police say two men left a Guelph Street restaurant arguing when the younger man kicked the right front fender of the elder man's 1981 Datsun. A Georgetown man, 18, has been charged with wilful damage. He will appear in court May 1.


