All have been singing in theatre for a number of years, and all bring their special talents to this production. Marlene Johnston hails from Scotland and has been in Canada for 23 years. Growing up surrounded by music, Marlene was encouraged to sing at a young age. Always active in theatre, Marlene joined Globe in 1981 and has been involved in all nine of Globe's major productions. Some of her most memorable roles include the part of Gouch in Mame, and Irene Malloy in Hello Dolly. In Some Enchanted Evening Marlene plays the role of Anna, a woman who can be mysterious and sensual one minute and silly the next. Anna is like the mainstay in the group of five, strong and confident.






