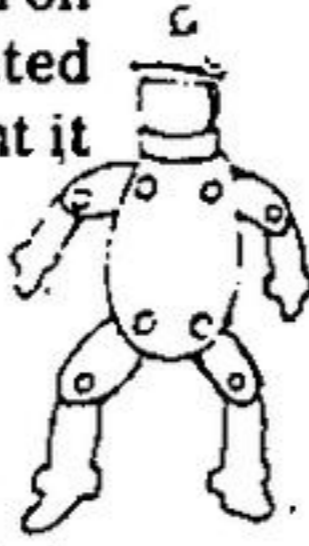
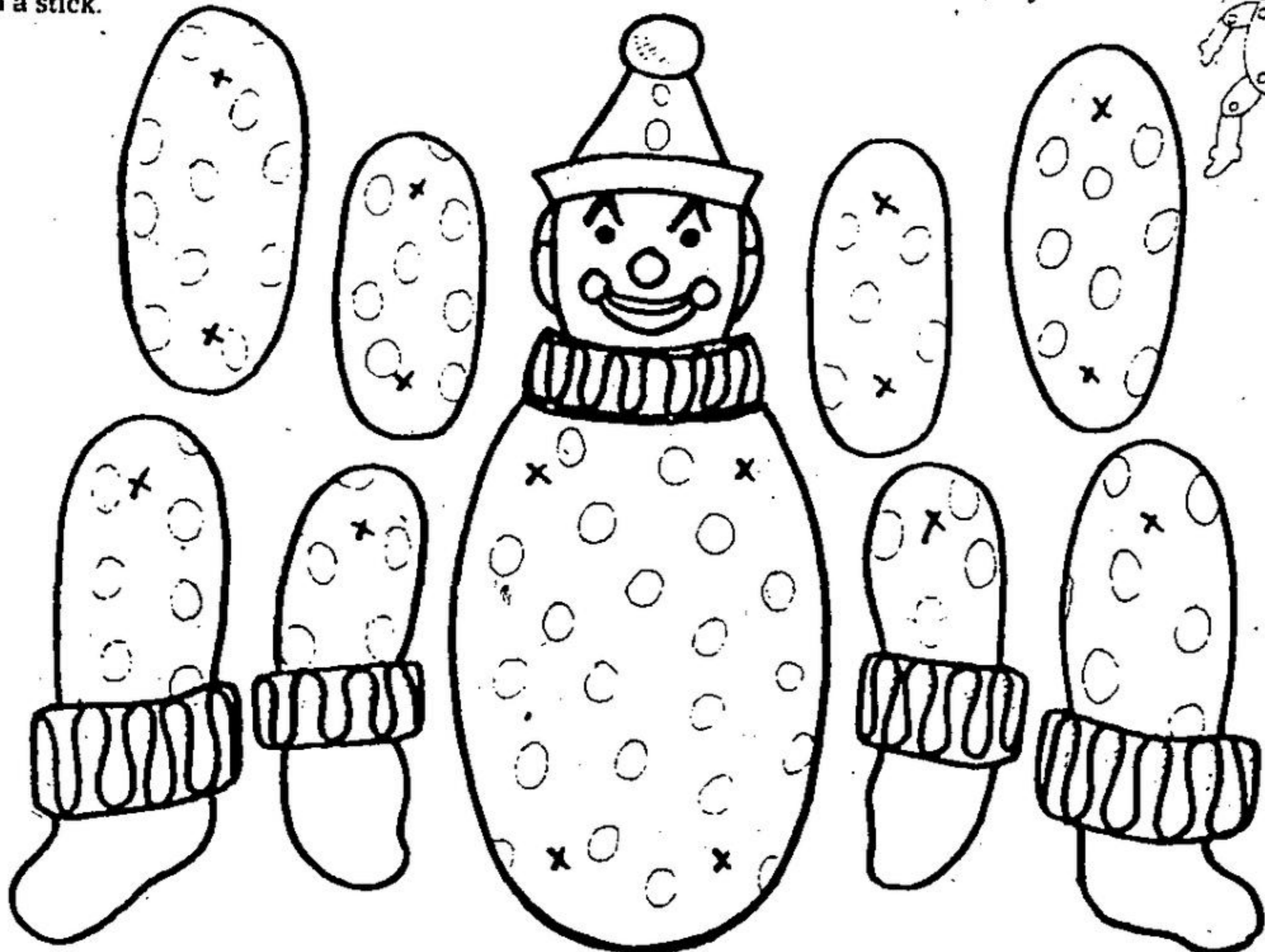

PUPPET PIECES

Use these puppet pieces to make a puzzle of your own. First, cut out the pieces after pasting them on stiff paper or thin cardboard. Join the pieces with brads (or loosely-tied string) at the points indicated by the x's. You can then either hang your puppet from a string attached to his hat, or you can mount it on a stick.

1. In the days when there were few books, and not many people could read, plays from the Bible were given in churches, often using hand puppets or marionettes.

2. Puppets were very popular during medieval times. They acted out stories of battles, miracles and magic. Often real people acted with the puppets.

3. Rod puppets are used in *bunraku*, a traditional form of Japanese theater. In this form of theater, the puppeteers, dressed

in black, work in full view of the audience.

4. The most popular form of theater in Indonesia is shadow plays featuring puppets created from lights focused above and behind puppets, creating shadows on a screen.

Q: What does a shark eat with peanut butter?

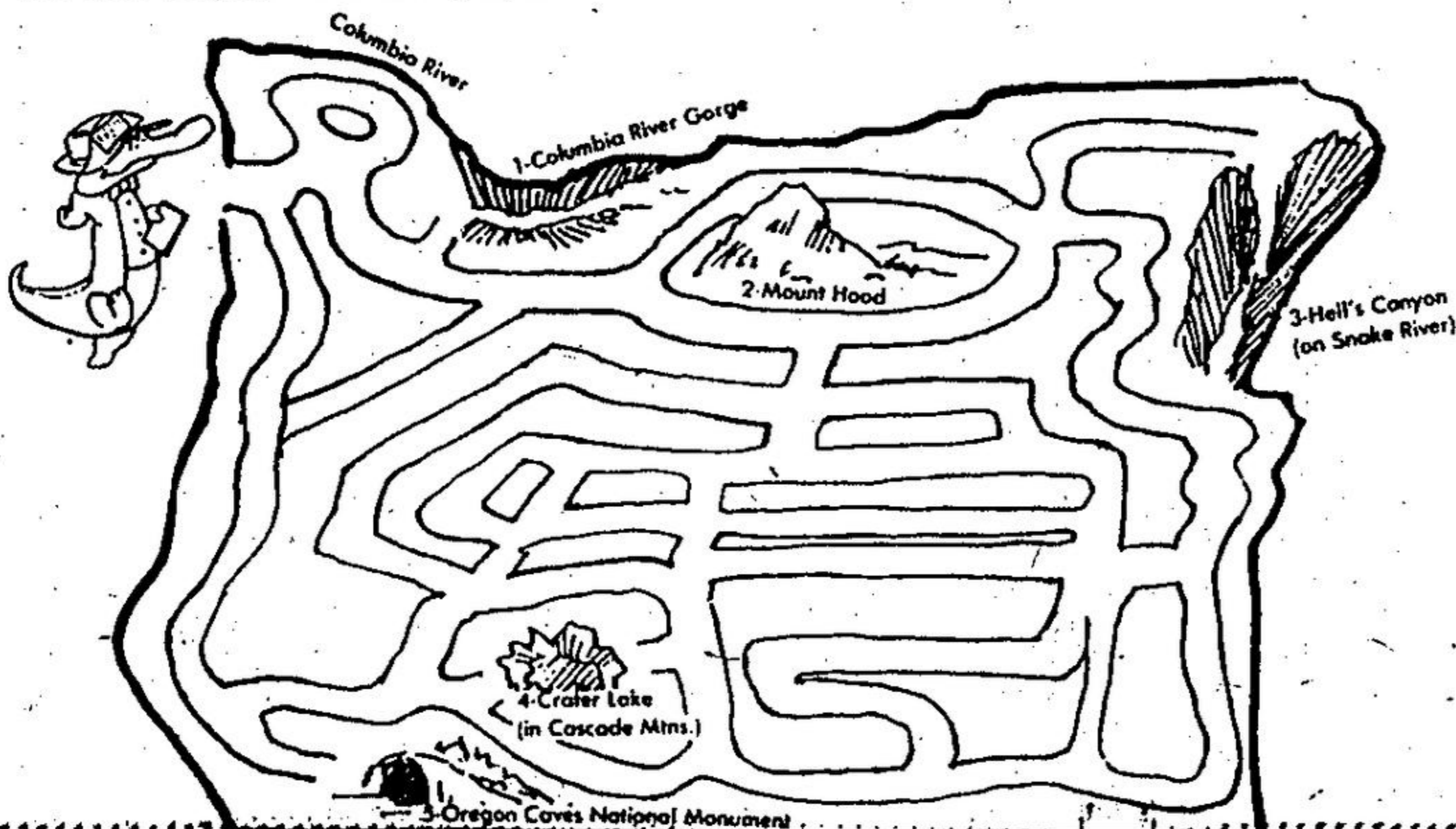
A: Jellyfish.

A: That sure hits the spot.

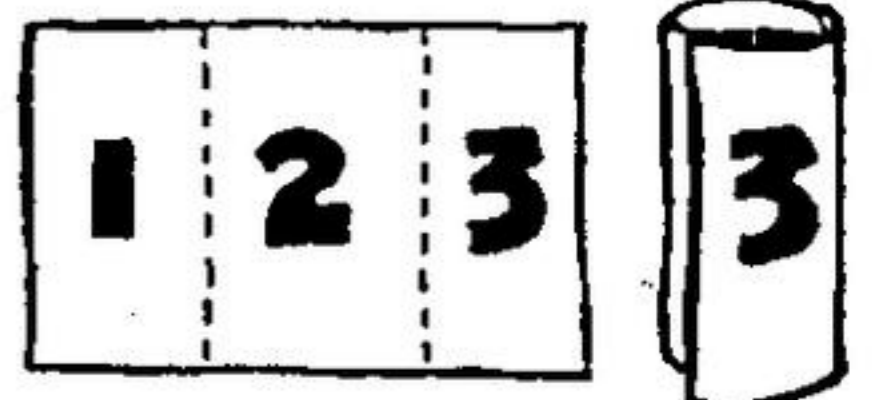
PACIFIC WONDERLAND

1. Fold your paper into 3 equal sections. Put section 1 on 2 and section 3 on top.

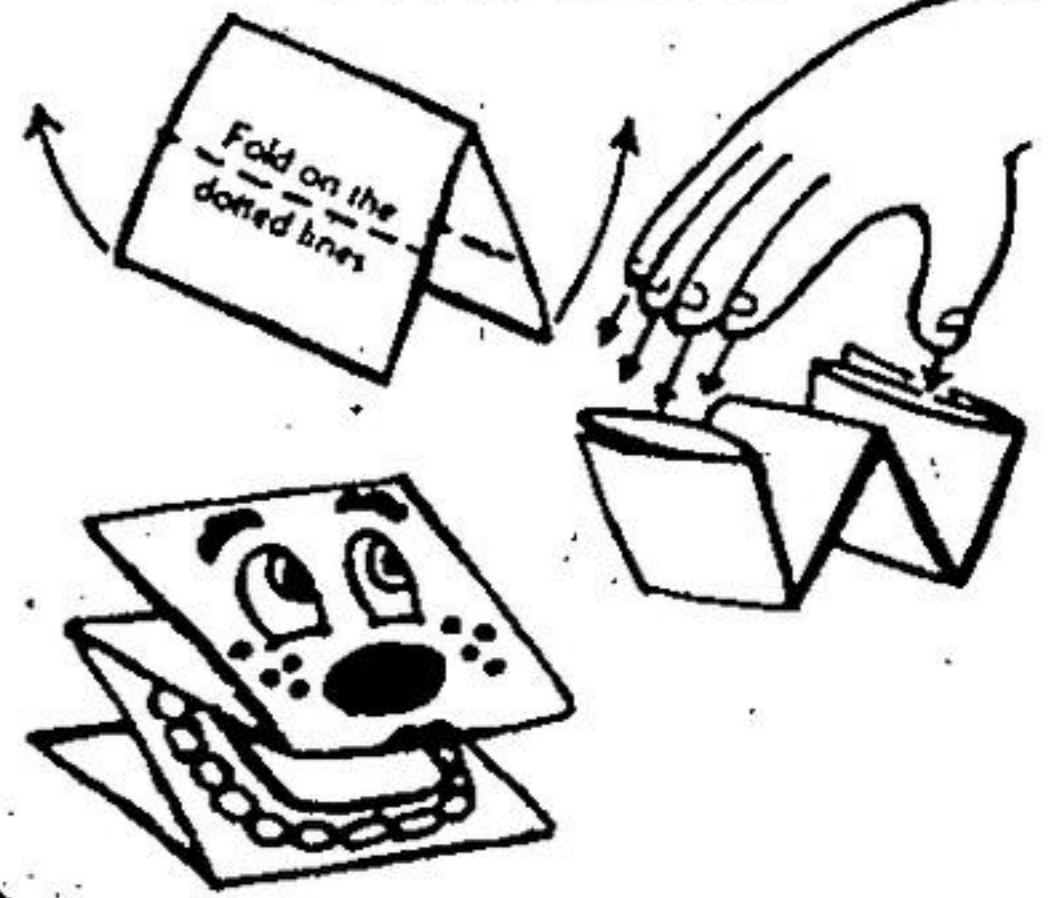


You will need:

One 8 1/2" x 11" sheet of paper, 2. Fold in half to make into a tent. crayons, glue and yarn.



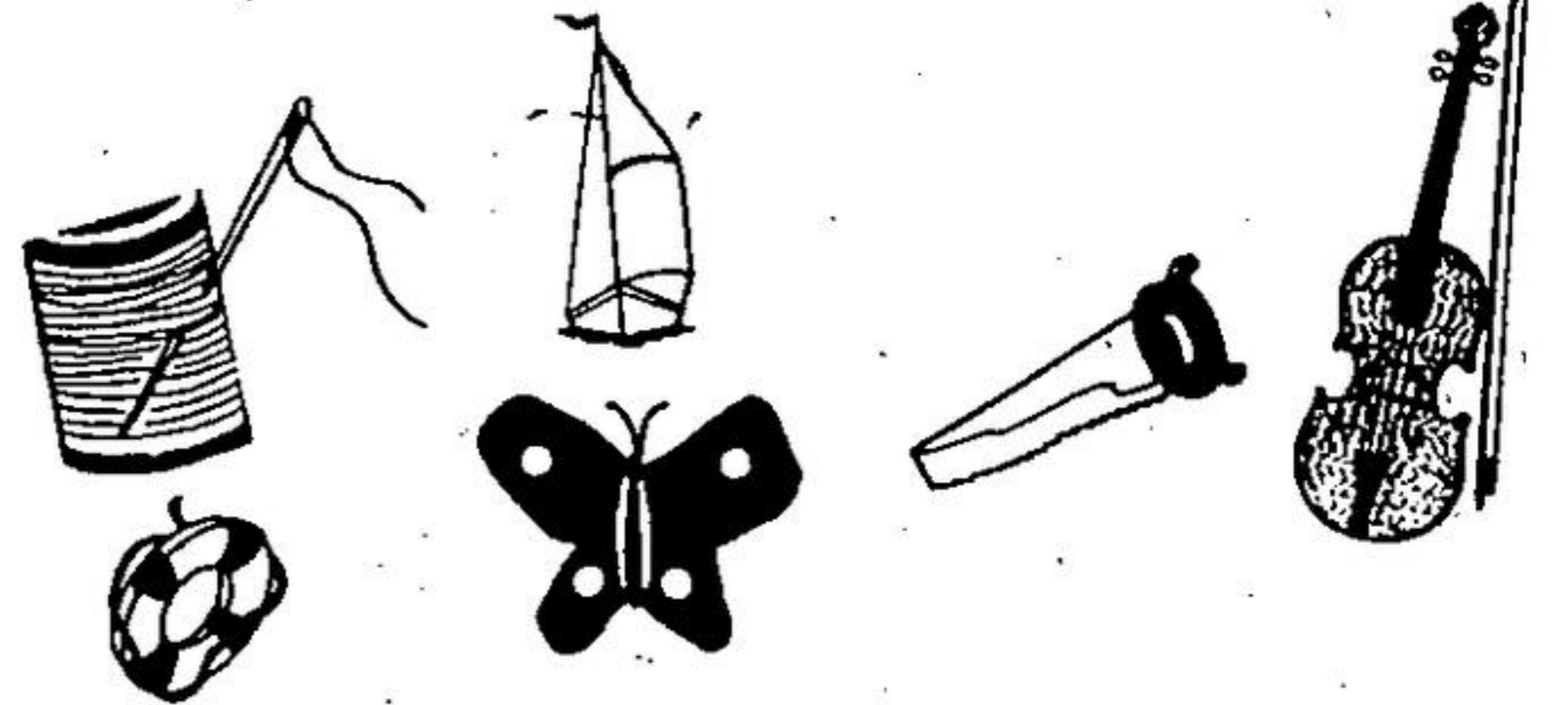
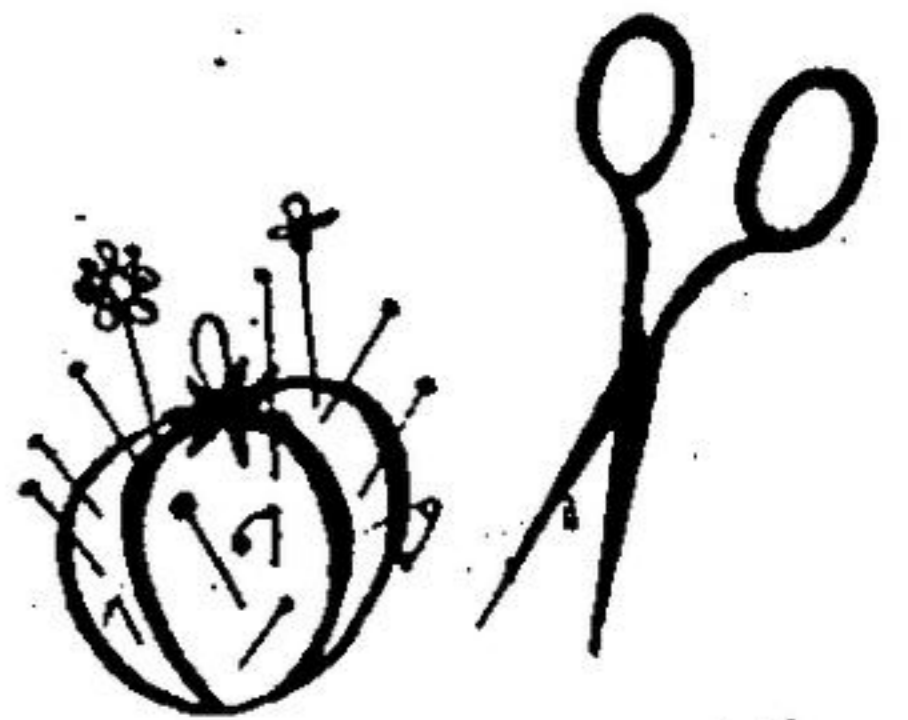
3. Fold the tent into a W.
