Two suspects in Variety Store robbery

Crime Stoppers of Halton and the Halton Regional Police are requesting your assistance in locating two suspects responsible for the robbery of the 7-Eleven Store, located at 450 Appleby Line, Burlington.

On Friday, Feb. 10, 1989 at 2:12 a.m., two young males entered the 7-Eleven Food Store. The suspects approached the lone male employee and ordered him to give them all the cash from the till. The employee at first refused until one of the suspects reached into his coat pocket and threatened the employee with a gun. The suspect partially produced the gun, showing only the handle and the cylinder of the gun.

The employee then handed over all the money from the till, plus two cartons of Export "A" extra light cigarettes that the suspects had demanded. The suspects fled on foot, towards New Street and then headed west on New Street until they disappeared from the victim's sight.

Suspects are described as:

1. Male, white, 23-24 years, 5'8"-5'10", approximately 200 lbs., moustache and beard - red in color, brown hair. He was wearing a white zip-up coat with the hood over his head, blue jeans and black snowmobile boots. This suspect produced the gun and did all of the talking.

2. Male, black, 21-22 years, 5'8"-5'10", 220 lbs., clean shaven. He was wearing navy blue winter coat with hood over his head, black jean pants. Suspect did not speak.

Police Beat

Shoplifting charge

A male senior allegedly tucked \$27 in steaks and cold cuts into his pockets at a Guelph Street grocery store Friday morning. Police say a man put Salisbury steaks and delicatessen meats in his pockets and left the store without paying for them. A Georgetown man, 65, will appear in court May 8 on a charge of theft under \$1,000.

Woman charged

Police say a woman tried to skip out on paying for an item at Shopper's Drug Mart in Georgetown Saturday afternoon. A woman placed a skipping rope valued at \$3 in her pocket and left the store without paying at 4:30 p.m. Police say a Georgetown woman, 37, will be charged with theft under \$1,000. She will appear in court May 8.

Assault charges

A Georgetown man, 20, is charged with assault following an incident at Windsor Drive March 31. Police say a passenger in a car was assaulted when a man hung from the door frame and kicked the passenger, 22, in the jaw. The accused will appear in court May 15.

Fence struck

Police say a 1989 pick-up truck went out of control Monday night, striking a stop sign and a fence at Fifth Line and Sideroad 22. Police say the truck driven by an Acton man, 18, was northbound on Fifth Line when it failed to turn and left the roadway. The Acton man has been charged with failing to report an accident and dangerous driving.

Narcotics charge

Police arrested two men for possession of a narcotic last week after marijuana and hashish oil were allegedly found on the men. Police stopped a vehicle at midnight Friday for a suspected liquor violation and found 2.5 grams of a suspected hashish-oil-like substance. An Acton man, 25, will appear in court May 8 on charges of possession.

Police also arrested an 18-year-old Acton male who was suspected of having six grams of marijuana on his person. Police say the arrest was in connection with a group of men smoking a substance appearing to be marijuana near a taxi stand at Main and Mill Streets in Acton Thursday night. The Acton male, 18, will appear in court May 8 on the charge of possession of a narcotic.

Impaired charge

A Beamsville woman is charged with impaired driving after she allegedly fell asleep in her car. The car was found halfway into the east ditch on Eighth Line early Monday morning, say police. The woman, 32, will appear in court May 15.



Man killed

A Mississauga man was killed when his car flipped over at the corner of Sideroad 5 and Winston Churchill Boulevard Friday afternoon. Halton Regional Police say Gary R. Ivan, 28, was pronounced dead at the scene. An investigation revealed that Mr. Ivan attempted to pass a northbound motorist when his car went out of control and landed in the ditch.
