Local businesses celebrated the end of an era Wednesday when

Curwood Packaging was honored as the last Georgetown Business of the Year by the Halton Hills Chamber of Commerce.

The newly created Halton Hills Chamber will choose a business from the entire town next year, leaving businesses in Georgetown, Acton and rural Esquesing eligible for the award.

Curwood president Barry Kedwell took in kudos and barbs during the awards dinner at the North Halton Golf and Country Club, culminating the night with a passionate defence of the packaging industry.

Curwood makes packaging for

perishable goods. Its clients include J.M. Schneider, Black Diamond, Kraft, Hostess Food Products and Fletchers Fine Foods.

Curwood opened in Georgetown in 1969 with just six employees. The firm now employs 165 people in a 115,000-sq.ft. plant on Armstrong Avenue.

The packaging industry has taken the brunt of some unfair criticism in recent years, according to Mr. Kedwell.

The concept of "overpackaging" is misunderstood by some groups which criticize packaging companies, said Mr. Kedwell.

"We are not producing anything today that society does not want," he said. "If we want to go back to

> He referred to a recent cyanide scare in Chilean fruit and vegetables and a highly publicized incident in which someone thought battery acid was injected into an orange.

"People don't want to buy food in our society today that is not perceived to be well packaged."

"We are not committed to overpackaging any more than society is asking for," said Mr. Kedwell.

"I know packaging causes problems (but) most times it's because it doesn't get put in the trash container."


