

## Subtle changes planned for 1989 UW campaign

There will be some subtle changes in the 1989 Halton Hills United Way campaign but organizers expect next year's campaign to be every bit as successful as 1988.

Campaign chairman for Halton Hills, Steve Williamson will be replaced by 1988 campaign chairman for Acton, Jim Lindsay.

"It's just healthy to get someone new in there to get a fresh perspective," said Mr. Williamson. He joined the United Way of Halton Hills in 1986.

Jim Lindsay led the Acton campaign that tripled its donations

over 1988. He said for next year the United Way will begin to emphasize less door-to-door canvassing and more industrial canvassing.

"We would like to put more emphasis on the country canvass this year," he said, but added that door-to-door campaigning could be replaced by more industrial campaigns, as is the trend in the Metropolitan Toronto area.

"We're trying to get away from canvassing door-to-door if we can... they don't do it in the big cities like Toronto," he said.

Arlene Bruce, a trustee for the Halton Board of Education and long-time United Way member, will be the United Way's next president. Mrs. Bruce is a resident of Acton and has been with the United Way of Halton Hills since its inception. She was the person to first call Jim Lindsay on the phone and ask him to canvass for the United Way.

Mrs. Bruce said the United Way's focus is to "ensure that we're doing things that will bring back high returns for the agen-

cies." The Halton Hills United Way honored over 150 volunteers in a year-end ceremony recently at the Acton High School.

This year the United Way allocated \$79,000 to 19 local agencies. The Red Cross was the recipient of a large percentage. "The Red Cross, as a partner, has a special status in the United Way," said Mrs. Bruce. When the Red Cross joined the United Way, then chairman John Wickens came to the United Way and is still on the board of directors.

The board of directors has over 20 people to work out campaign strategies and future goals.

The 1989 campaign will be planned this spring in a series of United Way meetings.

New campaign chairman Jim Lindsay said it "will probably take a few meetings" before the target for 1989 is determined. Goals will be outlined in strategy sessions, he said.

The United Way board of directors will meet April 26.

## Kinsmen gear up for auction

The Kinsmen Club of Georgetown is gearing up for what is expected to be their most successful fundraising project of the year. The club has arranged with Halton Cable TV to run their annual TV Auction live on Monday, May 8, from 6 p.m. to 11 p.m.

The Kinsmen have been canvassing local businesses for support and in such a project as this, everybody wins. Merchants who donate items will receive free advertising during the auction, and viewers who bid successfully will get a bargain on which they will pay no sales tax.

The draw prize for the evening will be a 3 1/2 HP Bolens lawn mower donated by Outdoor Power Equipment.

Proceeds from the TV Auction will go towards community projects as well as Cystic Fibrosis, the Kinsmen's national project. Cystic Fibrosis is a hereditary disease of children and as yet there is no

known cure. However, during the last 26 years the average life expectancy has climbed from four years to 24 years of age.

The Kinsmen are excited about this special fundraiser and have been working hard to make this not only a successful fundraising project but also to make it an entertaining evening for the viewers.
