Not wanting to take a backseat to the big guys Georgetown revved up even higher to meet Georgetown's arch rivals Milton in their next

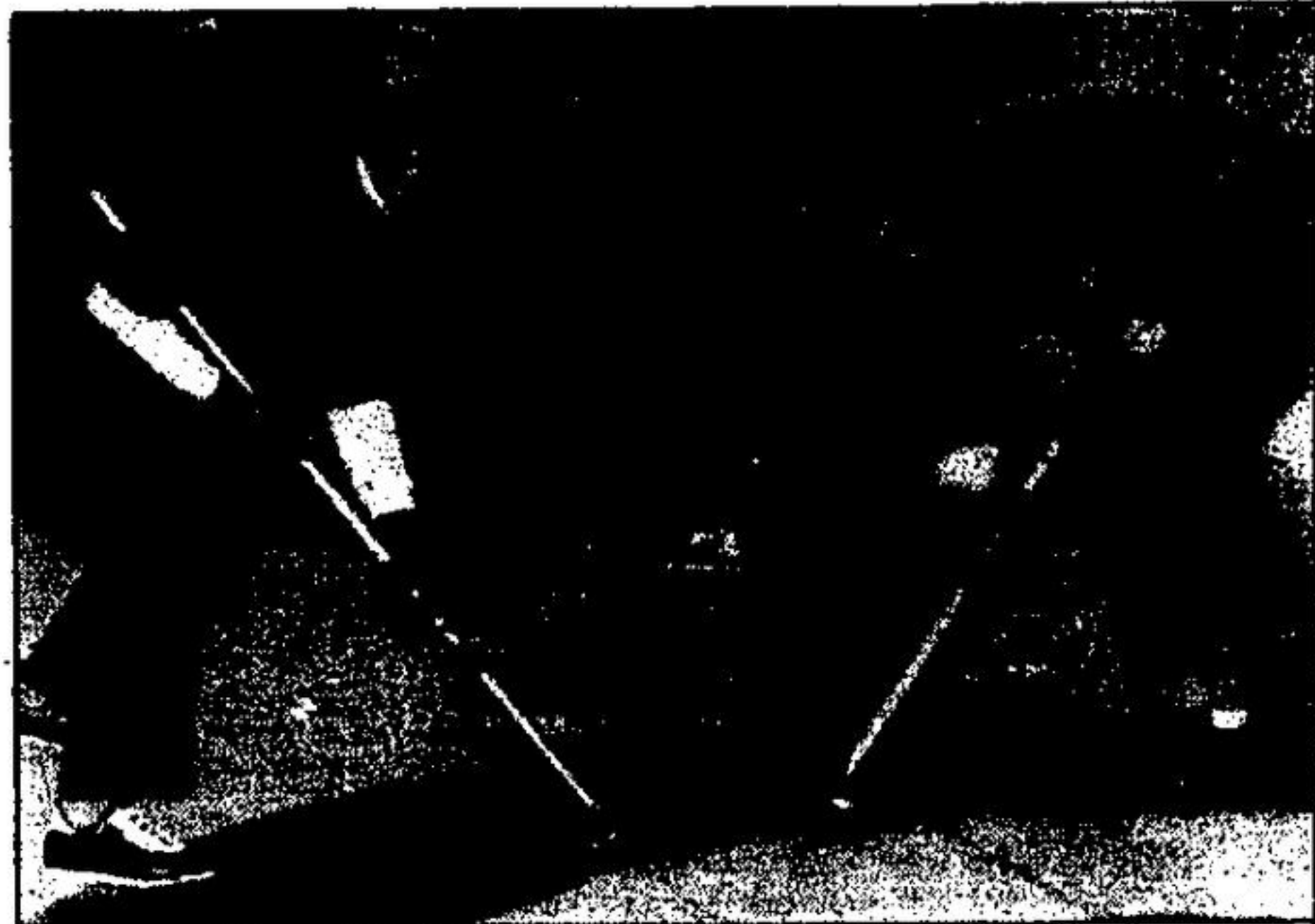
