

### Stereo stolen

A 1980 Chevrolet van left at a Guelph Street gas station for repairs received \$1,100 in damages the past few months. Police say the van was parked at the Petro-Canada station from February to April and is missing a stereo amplifier and four speakers.

### Charges laid

Police charged a Georgetown man, 42, with impaired driving Wednesday afternoon. The car was moving "erratically" when stopped by police at Guelph Street near Mill Street in Georgetown. The accused will appear in court May 8.

### Rings stolen

Police report the theft of three rings valued at \$1,500 from an Acton restaurant. A Toronto woman, 35, washed her hands in the ladies' room and left a wedding band, an engagement ring and gold ring at the basin. When she returned, the rings were missing.

### Woman charged

A Georgetown woman faces charges of shoplifting after she allegedly took \$31 worth of groceries from a Guelph Street store. The woman, 36, will appear in court May 1.

### Narcotics charges

A 17-year-old Georgetown male has been charged with possession of narcotics. Police say the youth was arrested in connection with a search at Church and Willow Streets which revealed two small vials of a suspected hashish oil substance. The youth will appear in court May 25 for breach of probation and June 5 for possession of a narcotic.

### Assault charges

A 38-year-old Georgetown man is charged with assault causing bodily harm in connection with an alleged belting of an 11-year-old girl. Police say a Georgetown girl received bruises to her back and buttocks from someone allegedly using a strap to strike her. Police have charged the Georgetown man with assault. He appeared April 12 for a bail hearing.

### Milton man killed

A Milton man was killed in a three-car collision at Guelph Line and Sideroad 10 Monday morning.

Halton Regional Police say a 1989 Ford pick-up, eastbound on Sideroad 10, struck a southbound 1983 Plymouth after the Ford slid into the intersection.

The Plymouth spun around into the northbound lane and was then struck by a northbound 1986 GMC pick-up truck, say police. That collision resulted in fatal injuries to Joseph Albert Laverge, 62, of Milton, the driver of the Plymouth.

The driver of the Ford van, a Moffat man, 30, has been charged with careless driving. He will appear in court May 15.

### Impaired charges

A Brampton man was charged by Halton Regional Police with impaired driving in Halton Hills Sunday afternoon. Police say the driver was allegedly driving erratically when stopped by police at Eighth Line and Steeles Avenue. A Brampton man, 31, was held April 10 for a bail hearing.

### Two charged

Police charged two out-of-town people with impaired driving in Halton Hills last weekend. A 24-year-old Windsor man faces charges of impaired driving after he was involved in a collision at Sideroad 22 near 10th Line. Police say the Windsor man will appear in court May 15 in connection with the April 8 collision.

### Car damaged

Police say a car was damaged while parked in a Guelph Street, Georgetown plaza April 5. Someone ripped the passenger's side mirror from the 1986 Buick, causing \$430 damage.
