Bell's new tower location unpopular

Halton Hills councillors are opposed to construction of a 180-foot Bell Cellular communications tower in the Hornby area.

The tower, if approved, would be located on a one-quarter of an acre lot on the north side of Steeles Avenue, east of the Sixth Line. The most recent application submitted by Bell for the tower construction was dated March 8 this year.

Mayor Russ Miller said he would like to "encourage Bell Cellular to look at another location." He said the present location near farmland on Steeles Avenue, could be "contentious."

"It's incumbent upon Bell Cellular to look for another piece of land," said Coun. Joe Hewitt.

"There are adjacent residences there... if the tower fell, there are concerns."

Coun. Hewitt said Bell had proceeded "carte blanche" in Caledon. Residents there, he said,

took Bell to the Ontario Municipal Board to prevent construction.

Town of Halton Hills deputy planner Bruce MacLean said under present legislation, a transmission tower could be built in Hornby.

"Because the facility is a federal government facility, it complies" with the zoning bylaws, he said.

Bell has looked at other sites but has considered them unavailable or "inappropriate," said Mr. MacLean.

But he added that some people are complaining that building a tower with its accessory equipment "is inappropriate to the location."
