Class designs new landscaping plans

The landscaping class met at Birchway Farms for its last meeting. Owner Carl Volman and his wife provided a wealth of information for the many questions asked of them. As Birchway carries a wonderful selection of plants, shrubbery and landscaping aids it was easy to see what would suit the 'individual' home. The course was very interesting.

In a prior meeting Jim Stansbury, a landscaping consultant was a guest speaker. Mr. Stansbury instructed the class on how to take a set course of steps when landscaping as well as addressing individual problems. As part of the course, the class will exhibit what they have learned with a landscaping project of the community centre. A large section of the wheelchair ramp will have a combination of hard and soft landscaping techniques. Two committees have been formed. John Loughton heads soft landscaping, which includes plants, shrubs and preparation of the soil.

Rene Alber is in charge of the hard landscaping, which is responsible for construction of a bench to sit on, placing the window well and any other solid, long-term materials needed. The group viewed the properly balanced and proportioned plan of the project while at Birchway Farms. Mr. Volman

had laid out the plans. Shrubby and plants included golf flame spirea juniper and fairview silver dogwoods which are easily maintained. To accomplish this project a fund has been set up at the Ballinacord general store. By depositing even a dollar in the box, you will be making this project more viable.

The Women's Institute has very kindly donated \$150 to the fund. The site plan can be viewed at the store.

Other news in the village included an open community meeting held at the community centre on Sunday, April 16 to discuss having a Canada Day celebration. There was a very small turnout. It was decided to go ahead with plans for Canada Day and to encourage more support. Many possible activities were discussed.

The Women's Institute groups were very well received at the Milton Manor on their recent visit. About 75 elders enjoyed the home baked goods, sandwiches and the two large birthday cakes.
